Congressman Must Use Money.

General E. S. Osborne, congressman from
the Twelfth Pennsylvania district, contributes an interesting article to a weekly
periodical of Wilkesbarre, from which the
following extracts are taken:

"For a congressman to live in the capital,
that is, to make even a very mediocre
figure in society, he must spend an amount
equal to at least twice his salary. I should
likink \$15,000 a year would hardly go far in
giving a man anything like a prestige. I
mean, of course, the average congressman,
the person who has neither brilliancy nor
social standing to commend him. It is a
fact, and a regrettable one, that a congressmen is measured by the money he spends,
not by his ability or merit.

"Take the average congressman, who

endeavors to five within his modest salary, and he lives in a very unpretentious way. A cheep boarding-house, say from \$8 to \$10 per week (a boarding-house equal to a clerk's boarding-house in Philadelphia), is his temporary home. His social life is a narrow one, as must necessarily be the life of a representative who has no wealth to squander. He is a fit prey to the lobbyists; an easy subject for shrewd jobbers, for he sees the others living in clover and knows that it is within his reach and temptation is not always resisted.

"But taking it all in all, the congressmen do not always resisted." Very few, if any, of them save any money out of their salary. It is possible for a man to live, but his standing is impaired and his prospects damaged beyond repair. There is no reason why a man could not live within his means beyond that of social pleasure."

Settlers Driven From Their Cabins.

The Northern Pacific railroad on Saturday completed the work of evicting upward of four hundred settlers and their families, who, supposing they were conforming to the regulations of the government, located on the edge of the reservation soon to be opened in Minnesota. The commissioner of the general land office decided that the lands were included in the Northern Pacific indemnity belt, and the railroad company sent out an armed force of evictors, who drove the settlers, with their families and stock, off the lands.

So roughly were these evictions made that many of the cabins contain articles of household furniture just as they were hastily abandoned. These people are without money and many of them must starve unless aid is sent to Brainerd, Minn., at once, as the city authorities have no means of providing for the hundreds now there.
