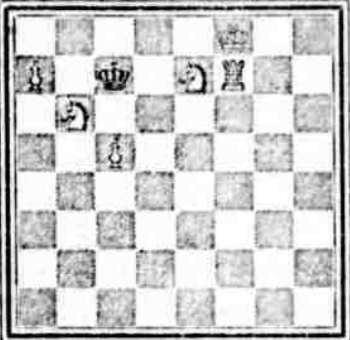

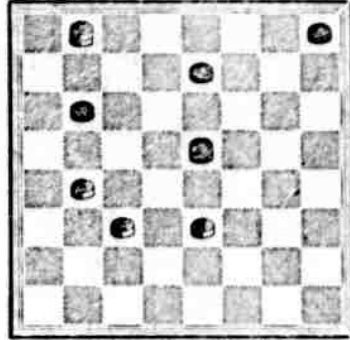

White to play and mate in two moves. Chess problem No. 29—By A. Hannah. Black—4, 7, 9, 15.

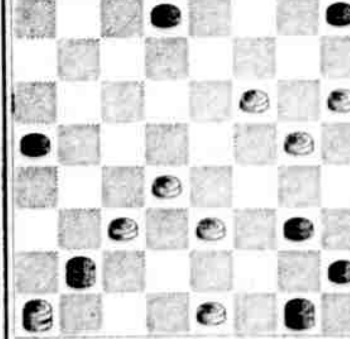


White—1, 17, 22, 24. White to play and win. SOLUTIONS.

"CHEVALIER" IRA PAINE. A Noted American Marksman Who Won Decorations from Monarchs.

Ira Paine, who recently died in Paris, was one of the most noted marksmen in the world. He was American born, though of late years he was fond of prefixing "chevalier" to his name, but he was more generally called captain. He was a man of great skill with shotgun.

been established long ago. He traveled over two continents and exhibited before thousands. Capt. Paine had shot in every capital in Europe, and appeared in almost every royal palace from St. Petersburg to London. As a reward for a private exhibition at Lisbon the king of Portugal knighted and decorated him in the presence of the American minister, John M. Francis, and Commander Newell and his officers, of the Niagra. The king's enthusiasm led him to join the American in pistol shooting at the close of the performance.

The records of some of the captain's feats are remarkable. His speed was surprising and his accuracy was marvellous. At the Lisbon palace he loaded a Winchester rifle and hit an eight-inch target thirty-five times in one minute. In May, 1888, at Cronstadt, on board the United States ship of war Lancaster, he loaded and fired the American Hotchkiss rifle, single loader, thirty-two times in one minute. With a Mauser rifle, before Von Rameke and the German troops, he loaded and hit an eight-inch target twenty-seven times in one minute. In 1881, at the great London revolver trials, Paine hit a five-inch target fifty times in succession. His feats at the famous Galleries Revette, Paris, had never been equaled, and Justice Paine's feat as a marksman had never entered that 80-year-old gallery.

His last foreign achievement was the defeat of Herr Schludhoff, Vienna's pride, in September, 1885, winning the most noted pistol match on record. The military were greatly interested in this contest, from the reports of the competitors and the distances agreed upon—40, 120 and 325 yards. Paine won with ease at all three distances, and nearly doubled his opponent's points. Paine hit a target 19 by 25 inches, at 325 yards, with a pistol, of hand shooting, 77 times in a hundred. He won a gold medal and other souvenirs at that contest. When in America he traveled with a vaudeville company, and last season he was with Frank Robbins' circus. His defeats were few, and of these his long time rival, Capt. Bogardus, scored the most against him.

Last winter Capt. Paine and his wife, who helps him in his work on the theatre boards, left for Paris, and while they were playing there he was seized with strangulation of the bowels and died after great suffering. It was also remarked that Paine grew too fleshy.
