#### WHY THE LEAVES TURN. Explanation of the Causes of the sted and

Golden Glory of Autumu. Prom the Field and Forest.

"Probably not one person in a thousand knows why leaves change their color in the fall," remarked an eminent botanist the other day, "The common and old-fashioned idea is that all this red and golden glory we see now is caused by frosts. A true and scientific explanation of the causes of the coloring of leaves would necessitate a long and intricate discussion. Stated briefly and in proper language, those causes are these: The green matter in the tissue of a leaf is composed of two colors, red and blue. When the sap ceases to flow in the fall and the natural growth of the tree ceases oxidation of ithe tissue takes place. Under certain conditions the green of the leaf changes to red, under different conditions it takes on a yellow or brown tint. The difference in color is due to the difference in combination of the original constituents of the the Field and Forest. color is due to the difference in combina-tion of the original constituents of the green tissue and to the varying conditions of climate, exposure and soil. A dry, cold climate produces more brilliant foliage than one that is damp and warm. This is the reason that our American autumns are more gorgeous than those of

There are several things about leaves that even science cannot explain. For in-stance, why one of two trees growing side by side, of the same age and having the same exposure, should take on a brilliant red in the fall and the other should turn yellow; or why one branch of a tree should be highly colored and the rest of the tree have only yellow tint, are questions that are as impossible to answer as why one member of a family should be perfectly healthy and another sickly. Maples and oaks have the brightest colors."
