

JOSEPH CLARKSON DEAD.

A WELL-KNOWN CITIZEN FOR MANY YEARS PROMINENT IN BUSINESS CIRCLES.

He served One Term as County Auditor. One of the Founders of the Banking Firm of Stehman, Clarkson & Co.

Joseph Clarkson, a prominent and well-known citizen of Lancaster, died early suddenly this morning at his residence, No. 230 East King street, aged 63 years.

Mr. Clarkson was a native of Lancaster, and was born in 1825. He was the son of Gerard Clarkson, for several years cashier of the Farmers' National Bank, and grandson of Rev. Joseph Clarkson, who was rector of St. James' Episcopal church from 1796 until his death in 1830.

He also served as clerk of the board of county commissioners for a short time and was elected to the position of county auditor in 1845.

After his retirement from the board of auditors he was employed by the late John B. Smith & Co. for the last few years he had been the chief bookkeeper of J. B. Martin & Co.

His wife, who was a Miss Simpson, four daughters and one son. His eldest daughter is the wife of Major A. S. Edwards.
