A writer in the current number of Medical Classics discusses at considerable length the part played by the beard in human history, and the general, but questionable, habit of shaving, which appears to be on the increase in civilized life. Quite a number of races are not provided with beards, the climates in which they live and their effeminate natures and habita not requiring such protection; but all the vigorous, pushing and progressive races have been abundantly provided with this appendage, and the writer claims that as there is nothing in nature without a use, this of itself is an argument iff flavor of wearing it, rather than shaving it off. Adam necessarily had a beard, because until the advent of Tubal Cain there was no genius to make a razor with which to elly it. Moses, one of the greatest of sanitarians, compelled the Hebrews to wear the beard long on their chins. All the great men of ancient times are represented as wearing long beards. The absence of one led Queen Eleanor to secure a divorce from Louis VII. and marry Henry II. of England, from which sprang the bloody wars which "for more than two hundred years ravaged the land and ultimately cost France three million soldiers."

There have been several periods in history where men either shaved portions of their faces or trimmed their beards into odd shapes, but never has there been such general abandonment of this hairy appendage as at present. In other ages its removal was confined to fops and the petted darlings of drawing-rooms, who were then regarded as of little more importance than ladies' lap-doga; but to-day it is not uncommon to find men of genuine ability and worth without a particle of hair on their faces, and very often they wear nothing but moustaches. The article in question gives a number of reasons why this fashion should be discontinued, but the principal one is cookiously sensible that there is no need to eite others. In a climate like ours the removal of the beard is dangerous to health. Men in the winter time, whether with their he throat produces perspiration and their sidden change to the open air, which ilmost always occurs after an effort, is dangerous. From an esthetic point of view, the beard when properly trimmed is preferable to shaving, and only those who are unable to grow a decent beard, like the fox in the fable who lost his tail, reap any advantage from the foolish habit. Women, moreover, as a rule prefer men with beards to those who have none, because the hair faces show that they are men, that they are different from themselves, and the mous-tache, no matter how luxuriant, does not up for the sacrifice of the hair on the

rest of the body.

It is doubtful, however, after all, if any of these arguments will induce men to lorego the pleasure of a clean face.
