

GAVE BAIL FOR COURT.

THE COLOMBIA 'NEWS' LABEL SUIT TO BE SETTLED BY A JURY.

Stephen Chard, Frederick Ford and L. Miller, Trainmen, are Severely Injured - Under Door Club's Night.

COLUMBIA, Nov. 20.-A hearing in the case of Freeman S. Fry against the Columbia Daily News for criminal libel was held before Squire Evans last evening. The plaintiff denied all parts of the alleged libelous article published in the News, and proposed to produce evidence to show that the News is in the habit of publishing the plaintiff's name in connection with the woman in question. He produced the article in the News as referring to him. S. M. Paschall, of the News, did not deny publishing the article in question. H. M. North, esq., appeared as counsel for the News. Mr. Paschall gave bail for \$100 for court trial.

A car in train of engine No. 1,184 jumped the track at the Market street switches, at Harrisburg yesterday, causing several cars to be wrecked. The cars struck the C. & D. local train which was passing, and two cars of this train were also wrecked. Stephen Chard and Frederick Ford, of the C. & D. train, were slightly injured in the wreck. Chard had a bruise about the eye, and Ford was cut about the head.

Brakeman Lewis Miller had the little finger of his right hand crushed in some wheels on a car of C. & D. local this morning, breaking and lacerating the finger. Dr. Craig attended to the injuries.
