The treasurer stated that even if the order remained in status quo its receipts will exceed the expenses by \$15,000 year each. It was recommended that some year each. It was recommended that some action be taken by which it will be as easy for the people to borrow money from the government as it is for the national banks to borrow it. rrow it. Tuesday the convention of the

On Tuesday the convention of the Knights of Labor went into committee of the whole to consider the eight-hour-a-day movement. The committee on the state of order made its report on the question and it was decided not to endorse any general strike. Mr. Samuel Gompers, president of the American Federation of Labor, forwarded a letter to the cenvention, in which he said that his men were opposed to a general strike, but would undertake one unless the manufacturers agreed to the reduction of labor hours. The committee, besides its report, submitted the following resolution, which was adopted:

"Resolved, That we coincide with the last expressed views of the president of the American Federation of Labor, expressing as they do the sentiments of that organization that no 'general strike' should be inaugurated upon May 1st, 1890, and that the movement should be confined to such trades as 'are in condition' to put the plan in operation on May 1st, 1890.

"Resolved, That we call upon the president of the American Federation of Labor to indicate the trade or trades organized within the folds of that society which is or are prepared to successfully inaugurate the eight-hour movement on May 1, 1890, confident that the Knights of Labor will lend their moral support to the movement in favor of such trade or trades."
