The county commissioners to-day fixed the tax rate at 3 mills for 1800 and also desided to pay off \$50,000 of the bonded debt on April 1st. The two mill rate is lower than at any time since the war. It has been as high as three mills, but 2) has been the rate for some years.

The valuation of property taxable for county purposes in 1888 was \$56,000,000. In 1889 it was \$84,000,000, and in 1890 the valuation will be the same as in 1889.

The reason the commissioners can reduce the rate of taxation with a less valuation is that the current expenses of the county have been cut down about \$50,000 a year.

There was a balance in the county treasury on January 1, 1889, of \$116,173.47. The county is benefitted to the amount of \$16,000 a year through its share of the license fund.

The bonded debt of the county is \$200,000 and after April 1 next will be only \$150,000.
