These riders learned in which direction the thieves had gone after abandoning the team and they followed on their trail to Voganville. There they were arrested.

They gave their names as Jacob Fount and George Pyfer and their ages as 19 years. They did not deny having taken the team when charged with the theft, but claimed that they had no intention of stealing it.

Mesara Irwin and Miller kept the boys in custody from the time of their arrest about midnight, until this morning, when they took them before Justice Keller, of Ephrata, and preferred charges of horse stealing against them.

They were unable to give bail, were brought to Lancaster on this afternoon's train and lodged in county jail, where they will remain until the January term of the quarter sessions, when their cases will be tried.

If convicted, the man who arrested them will be entitled to the county's reward of \$20 in each case offered for the arrest of horse thieves.
