He said: The Philadelphia gentlemen appeared to favor the taxation of corporate property, now exempt, to assist, if need be, in the construction of better roads throughout the state. One thing is certain, namely, that we can hope for no improvement in our country roads so long as the unit in their control of construction and management is the township. On this point the convention agreed unanimously, but there was a difference of opinion as to how far the state abould go independently of country socion. The majority of the convention favored, I think, a general law applicable to all counties, vesting in the hands of the commissioner in conjunction with an engineer, which last named official be appointed by the court in each judicial or county district, the authority to classify the roads, and to determine from year to year upon which highways the proceeds of a general county tax might be expended, and further empowered to supervise the work and harmonize the system of improvement on the less traveled road with a view unit-mately of bringing all of the public roads into a proper condition. A state board under this system might be organized to adject difficulties liable to arise upon roads connecting county seats, and to assist the poorer sounties which have such rocky roadbeds, and finally to make taxation uniform throughout the state.

We have during the last 50 years squandered, it is estimated, in this state for advantage of the National turnipite in Washington, Beaver, Armstrong, Butter and Westmoreland counties, but must pay a fair share of the cost, and must sak the Legislature to authorize the counties to assist in their corporate capacity.
