

AN ILL-FATED BUILDING.

Another Disaster at the Buckard Book Store in Indianapolis.

Fifteen or Twenty-five Persons Reported to Have Been Killed by Part of the Roof Falling Upon Them.

Indianapolis, March 19.—A part of the roof of the Buckard, Merrill company building, which projected from the iron front, fell at 1 o'clock this afternoon, burying a number of men.

It is believed that from 15 to 25 persons are killed or injured.

Great excitement prevails.

Ten persons were killed in the collapse of the walls at the book store in Indianapolis and eighteen men were seriously injured.

The rescuers worked all day yesterday, and by evening had got out nine of the dead bodies.
