THE OYSTER SEASON CLOSES. Where They Are Caught and How They Are Marketed.

Where They Are Caught and How They Are Marketed.

On Thursday people were supposed to my good-bye to the oyster, as the law forbids sales and custom, which is stronger than law, taboos the bivalves. The law is practically a dead letter, but oyster sales rapidly fall off after May lat.

The Philadelphia Ledger reports that the past oyster saeson has been a remarkably good one, with a steady supply and prices well maintained, because dredgers found no occasion to secure a stock in anticipation of a freeze up. About 135 Philadelphia boats are in the oyster business, and in addition to their cargoes, from two hundred to three hundred thousand oysters a day are received in that city by rail in the height of the season. They come in sacks of a thousand oysters each. "The prices have ruled very regular the entire season, the average for primes \$7, and for cullings \$2.50 and \$3 a thousand. At one time primes were down to \$5 and at another up to \$8, but only for a brief pariod."

Chesapeake Bay oysters come in barrela. They contain from 450 to 000 primes and from \$200 to 1,000 cullings. The ruling prices have been from \$3.50 to \$5 for primes and from \$2 to \$3 for cullings a barrel.

The salt cysters, with which the Philadelphia market will be chiefly supplied during the summer, come from Tuckerton, Barnegat, Cape May and Absecon waterr. Chesapeake Bay will continue to furnish a few during May, which are caught by tonging, dredging being forbidden after the first of that month. Taking the trade in shell oysters all through the season, has advanced 20 per cent. over the previous ones.

The trade in opened cysters is increasing yearly, and Mr. Saylor, who is largely engaged in that branch in addition to dealing in shell cysters, says that his business in that line has increased 25 per cent. He has regular customers in Minneapolis, Chicago, Clincinnati and intermediate points, while in Northern New York his trade is very extensive. The cysters are packed in buckets and tubs, and, with a lump of ice thrown in, are carried safely and in good condition in all temperatures of the season.

New York formerly had the monopoly of some of these sections, but when their beds failed last fall Philadelphia took up the trade. Baltimore also does a heavy trade in opened cysters. Baltimore sells by the gallon exclusively, while Philadelphia generally sells by count. Opened cysters have sold during the season at from 50 cents to \$1.50 a hundred as to size, and by the gallon at from \$1 to \$2.
