EXPENSIVE INFLUENZA.

What La Grippe Has Cost the American

Life Insurance Companies. The 29 regular life insurance companies of the United States lost in the first quarter of this year \$1,018,460 from deaths from la grippo. Their death losses from pneunonis and bronchitis foot up \$1,827,184 as against \$1,154,145 in corresponding three months of 1889, showing an increase of \$673,036. As this large increase was probably caused by the epidemic they figure the total cost to them of is grippe as \$1,091,-196. The dates and observations reported by these companies to the Actuarial Society America indicate that the epidemic carried away generally their older policy bolders and many who would readily have umbed to disease and for this reason they believe that their losses during the remainder of this year from other diseases will be much less and thus make their total mortality for the twelve months only about the normal annual average.




