Hon. Richard Vaux, lawyer and politician, was born Dec. 19, 1819, and is a son of Hon. Robert Vaux, who was a judge of common pleas court of Philadelphia, and one of the originators of the public school system of Pennsylvania. Richard studied law with Wm. M. Meredith, and was admitted to practice a year before he stained his majority. Soon after his graduation in law he went to Europe, and until 1840 was secretary of legation at London and otherwise employed. In 1841 he was appointed recorder of Philadelphia, holding the office seven years, "and it is a fact worthy of mention that no decision rendered by him during that period was ever reversed by the higher courts." In 1842 he was the Democratic caudidate for mayor of Philadelphia, reducing the prevalent majority from 5,000 to 600. About the same time he was appointed by the state supreme court as inspector of the state prison, and was soon after elected a controller of public schools. In 1847 he resigned the recordering and resumed law practice. In 1856, after three contests for the mayoralty, he was elected, defeating Hon. Henry D. Moore.
