Court Decision.

It is altogether likely that Pittaburg will before long have "original package" maloons. Disappointed applicants for license under the Brooks high license law, aided by Ohio browers and distillers, will test the practical effect in this state also of the recent decision of the supreme court of the United States in the Iowa case. Attorneys for the liquor people in Pittaburg and Prohibitionist lawyers unite in the opinion that this decision substantially wipes out the Brooks law, and that liquor

opinion that this decision substantially wipes out the Brooks law, and that liquor may be sold in original packages without state license at all.

Ex-Judge C. S. Feiterman, noted for being well vorsed in constitutional law, said: "I see no reason whatever to prevent any of the several hundred wholesale applicants, recently refused in Allegheny county, from opening their houses and carrying on the business under this decision.

"They may go ahead without fear of interierence. The only precaution they must observe would be to import all their liquors from some other state—Ohio or West Virginia, for example—and to dispose of them without breaking the packages as they come to them. I should not be surprised to see what might be called 'original package' houses opened throughout the city."

W. M. Price, a well known Prohibition lawyer, said: "The decision is decidedly beneficial to the liquor traffic, but most disastrous to the Brooks and other license or prohibitory laws of Pennsylvania. I see nothing to prevent any person whatever from opening a liquor store, taking out a United States license and importing his liquors from Ohio, or any other point. his liquors from Ohio, or any other point outside of the state, in packages from a half pint up, or in smaller quantities if he de-sires, and selling directly to the consumer without asking for a license under the

without asking for a license under the Brooks law or any other.

"Such houses can be established in all prohibitory districts, and there need be no fear of interference from the state authorities. I really believe there is nothing to prevent a man from selling it to persons who drink it on the premises, the only requirement being that the bottles in which the liquors are shipped into the state shall not be broken by the man who imports. I doubt very much whether there will be any effort to inferce the restrictive tendencies of the Brooks law after this year."

A number of lawyers were seen, and all A number of lawyers were seen, and all concurred in the foregoing views. The test is expected to be made without delay. is expected to be made without delay.

The saloon question took a new turn in Sioux City, Iowa, on Monday when the Law and Order League caused warrants to be issued against thirty saloon-keepers and the owners of buildings in which the saloons are located, asking for injunctions against both proprietors and owners. The saloon men said that they cannot be prevented from selling in original packages, and say they will quit by-the-drink trade and deal in original packages.

Preparations are being made in Topeka, Kansas, to open "original package" houses. Several Missouri broweries are negotiating with parties to act as agents in the sale of liquors, which are to be shipped in all quantities, from pints and quarts up to cases and barrels.
