Progress of the French Republic—The Election of...

Political affairs on the continent generally con-

tinues of an exciting character and of the highest

interest to Americans.

There appears to be a general though gradual im-

provement, notwithstanding the feverish state of

affairs throughout Europe and the political agitation

in all parts of Great Britain.

The French elections had taken place and all

passed off as heard from peacefully.

The moderate republican candidates were in the

majority in every arrondissement of France.

The French Republic, from which we copy most of our

communications of the late elections, but the value

of its testimony on the head now to be judged of by

the following extract:

"The same description of fraud in voting which

is so common an abuse in those cities of the United

States where universal suffrage is established, has

been already signalled in Paris.

"Universal suffrage" is what excites the ire of

the English Journal. It is remarkable that the mem-

bers of the French Government and their mem-

bers must be received with caution, and with many

grains of allowance for prejudice.

Republic is to take place on the 11th day of May,

which, from the preparations, would require the

concentration of the whole of April, in which 2,000

persons joined.
