

Warlike News by the Arctic.

The intelligence from Europe by the Arctic, is an unusually interesting and warlike character, more especially that from the Bosphorus, a part of the world which has for some time past been, and indeed is now, the scene of a good deal of diplomatic intrigue on the part of England, France and Russia.

The Russian Ambassador, Prince Menchikoff, having presented to the Sublime Porte his ultimatum, and that ultimatum being such a character as to leave Turkey no alternative but a declaration of war; and, as a preliminary to that step, the rumor was that she had solicited the alliance of France and England.

The peace of Europe is in imminent peril, as will be inferred from the foregoing, and in consequence of dispatches received by the Earl of Clarendon at the Foreign Office yesterday, his Lordship proceeded to Downing street, and immediately dispatched messengers to summon to the Admiralty, at the residence of the First Lord, James Graham, the leading members of the Administration now in town.

It is said that the Agamemnon, 110 guns, has been ordered to proceed at once from Portsmouth, to reinforce our squadron at Malta, whose services in the East are required; and that the Vendegre, 80 guns, Lord Edward Russell commanding, has been kept in readiness to sail from Plymouth harbor, has been ordered to the same destination.

Without entering further into the question, upon which everybody is silent, respecting the affairs in the East, it seems perfectly clear that the attention of the Ministry is directed to the present critical conjuncture of matters, and that a very alarming crisis is at hand, only to be averted by a thorough and energetic understanding between the Governments of France and England.

The cause of quarrel between Turkey and her powerful neighbor of the north have of late years been innumerable. In short, the world has imbibed a pretty substantial suspicion that a war with the Ottoman Porte has been brewing for some time past, and as a means of partitioning its territory a Poland, and helping herself to a much coveted seat on the Mediterranean. In such schemes there is a good reason to believe the Court of St. Petersburg has the most active cooperation of Austria.

At present they have seized upon two rather inconsistent pretensions for insult. Austria threatens to draw the sword in support of the barbarians of Montenegro, who, by the aid of British subsidies, she calls a Christian people; Russia, on the other side, menaces Constantinople with an attack in vindication of the claims of the Greek Church to certain sacred sites in Palestine, against the usurpation of that Romish hierarchy, which she pretends to protect, and of which she is indeed, the most zealous champion.

It is stated, in the Boston Herald, that Gen. Almer Curtis, a great shoe manufacturer, has discovered the means of giving a new and improved quality to his manufactures, and that he has secured a patent for the same.
