The Courant steamer Canada, with Liverpool dates to the 28th of May, arrived on the 6th inst. Her political news is of some importance.

In the British Parliament, Lord Clarendon and Russell had stated that the French and English Ambassadors were acting on a condition at Constantinople that the integrity of the Ottoman Empire would be preserved.

The Adelphi Theatre at Edinburgh had been burnt. Kosztus attended a meeting of the Society of the Friends of Italy on London, but made no speech.

The reported escape of O'Donoghue, the Irish patriot, from Australia, is confirmed, and he is now on his way to this country.

In Paris considerable attention has been taken in the money market, in consequence of a report that Russia had entered Turkey.

It was stated that Napoleon had assured the Russian Minister that, as much as he desired the peace of Europe, he would not permit Russia to be encircled by France.

Diplomatic relations between Switzerland and Austria had been entirely broken off.

The ultimatum of Russia had been rebuffed by the Porte, and a final answer to that effect will be given to Mexico on the 20th.
