Sec. 2. That hereafter all persons who shall pay their taxes to the Receiver of Taxes on or before the first day of July in each and every year shall be entitled to an abstoment of five per cent. After that date and on or before the first day of September the amount charged in the Duplicate must be paid; after the first day of September in addition to the tax in the duplicate two and half per cent. of the amount will be required to be paid. And all taxes remaining unpaid on the first day of December, shall be put into the hands of an Alderman or City Solicitor as the case may be for collection, with the prescribed percentage and costs of suit.

It shall be the duty of the Committee on Finance or any special Committee that Councils by resolution may appoint for the purpose, on the second days of July and September next, and on those days annually thereafter, to examine the Tax Duplicates at the office of the Receiver—to accertain the payments made to those respective periods and report the result of their investigations to the Select and Common Councils of the City, at their then next ensu-ing stated meetings.


