The four most extensive firms in the city are the only ones who are doing business in the flour market. The receipts and stocks continue light. There is very little export demand, and very little inquiry for flour consumption.

What comes forward quite freely but the demand, especially for inferior descriptions, is limited. Sales of 2000 bushels of inferior flour, and Southern, in lots, at \$1.10 per bushel for fair and prime Red, and \$1.17 1/2 for White.
