

The most horrible wounds to look at were those of the face. Two ounces of the first regiment had the whole under jaw carried away, and yet these brave fellows walked behind the carts of their comrades more dangerously wounded than any other.

For the most part they asked but for wine or water, for the loss of blood creates thirst, and the fatigues of the day must have been great from the length of the battle and the extent of the ground to be won.

The writer of the foregoing account of the battle next describes the wounded as they were brought to Castiglione. He estimates that he brought to that city alone at 10,000, and says:

It was certainly the most dreadful sight I ever saw. Every conceivable kind of wound which could be inflicted upon men was here exhibited in all its ghastly variety.

Every church, every large hall, every private house in the town, has been taken for the service of the wounded. Those whose injuries are slight, after having them dressed, pass at once into the hospitals and mingle with the wounded of the other regiments.
