CET I HAVE NO AGENTS LANCASTER COUNTY PRISON. Eleventh Annual Report of the Inspectors To the Honorabte the Judges of the Court of Quar ter Sessions of Lancaster County:

The HE undersigned, in pursuance of law, submit to the Court the following Report of the Pricon, for the year ending November 30, 1861.

On the Duth November 1860, there 

ed during the year, viz: By expiration of sentence and by In-

siderable decrease, as compared with last year, being then 91.

The number committed to Prison during the year, excepting those convicted, was 634 (116 less than last year) of which 469 were for vagrancy, drunksonness, and disorderly conduct, resulting from drunkenness; this is 82 less than last year. In addition to the 634, there were sent-need during the same periso 64, and remaining ite rison on the 30th of November, 1869, 114, making the above total in Prison during the year. Of the prisoners discharged, 4 were sent to the Fastern Penitentiary, 4 to the flouse of Refuge. 1 to the State Insane Asylum. 14 to the Lancaster County Poor House, 3 escaped, and 3 died. 2 of whom by consumption and the other of manina-apout. Of the 64 sentenced prisoners, 29 were convicted of larceny, 2 for burglary, 1 for robbery, 1 for kiduapping, 1 for assault and battery withintent to kill, and the residue for minor offences. There were twenty-seven less sentenced for one year and upwards, 1 as long as 6 years and three months; 45 were white and 19 were coived. But 25 of the convicts were born in Lancaster city and country, and 22 in foreign countries, of which 19 were no ives of Germany. 33 of the 44 convicts are under 31 years of age. 4 of the 64 convicts are femilies and of the 60 makes but 31 had born in Lancaster city and county, and 22 in foreign countries, of which 19 were na lives of Germany. 33 of the 44 cunvits as under 31 years of age. 4 of the 64 convicts are females, and of the 60 miles but 34 had trudes prior to their conviction; 10 are old offenders, and 64 are receiving punishment for their first offence. The 64 convicts were occupied as follows; 15 wearing carpet, 5 weaving check, 6 weaving bagging, 6 making chapter, 5 or of the 64 are unmarried. 58 of the convicts were of intemperate habits.

The whole number of prisoners received since the opening of the Prison, September 12th, 1861 to November 30th, 1861, was 5,511; white makes 4,620; white females 55; colored makes 577, and colored females 129

No epidemic prevailed among the prisoners during the year; the number of cases treated was considerably less than nast year, namely 175; being in the ratio of 100 cases treated to every 454 prisoners; 156 were cured, 16 relieved and 3 died.

The financial affairs and manufacturing operations of the Prison during the fiscal year, closing November 30th, 1861, are exhibited in detail by the following statement which contains all the information relating to those rubjects:

The whole number of days prisoners were bearded the past year was 41,260, 39,067 at 18 cents a day, and 2,259 at 12 cents a day, amounting in all to \$7.284 90, an average of \$500.0745 ere month; the number of the previous year was 48,279, costing \$8,650.22, averaging \$7.24-15145 per month average. The price paid the Keeper for coording souch vagrants as do not lator was reduced, in March last, from 18 to 12 cents per day. In consequence of that and the decrease in the number of that class of persons, the costs of the main-tenance of vagrants thus year is considerably less than \$3.894.66 in 1860, being \$1,134.06 of a diminution.


