Sacrifor I. The Select and Common Councils of the City of Lancaster, hereby ordain, that the bounty provided in the fifth Section of the Ordinance, to which this is a Supplement, thail be three hundred dollars, in lieu of the sum therein allowed.

SECTION 2. That it shall be lawful to issue the certificates
