It is a remarkable and most interesting fact, that the very first use to which the discovery of printing was applied, was the production of the Bible. This was accomplished at Meniz, between the years 1450 and 1455. Guttenberg was the inventor of the art, a goldsmith furnishing the necessary funds. This Bible was in two folio volumes, whichhave been justly praised for the strength and beauty of the paper, the exactness of the register, and the lustre of the ink. The work contained twelve hundred pages, and being the first ever printed, of course involved a long period of time and an immense amount of mental, manual, and mechanical labor; and yet for a long period after it had been finished and offered for sale, not a single human being, saves the artists themselves, knew how it had been accomplished.
