## Miscellaneous. The Inanguration Ball.

Zion's Herald (Methodist) expostulates earnestly against the proposed inauguration ball at Washington, to be given in the Patent Office building. It says: "While we regard it as a sin at any time, on such an occasion, for the nation's officiary to condescend to such levity as to attend and sanction a grand ball, we shall look upon it at this time as a flagrant insult both to God and men. We therefore hope that good sense and better judgment will prevail at Washington, and that, if for no other reason, out of respect to the memory of those who have died for the country out of sympathy for those who still weep and mourn, and out of decent regard for the Christian sentiments of the truest patriots in all the lands, there will be no Presidential inauguration ball this year."

## Who are the Happy?

Lord Byron once said: "The mechanics and workinmen who can maintain their families are, in my opinion, the happiest body of men. Poverty is wretchedness, but even poverty is preferable to the heartless,<sup>3</sup> unmeaning dissipation of the high orders." Another author says: "I have no propensity to envy any one, least of all the rich and great; but if I were disposed to this weakness, the subject of my envy would be a healthy young man, in full pos-session of his strength and faculties, going forth in the morning to work for his wife and children, or bringing home his wages at night."

## Rhode Island the Wealthiest State.

Rhode Island the Wealthiest State. The table of internal revenue derived from the different States, just published, shows the proportion of wealth to the population which exists in each State, and hence the proportional profits of capital to each. We should expect New York to exhibit the highest ratio, but its twenty-four millions of taxes, divid-ed among its population of nearly four million, give a tax of only \$6,25 to each individual. Pennsylvania with nearly thirteen million of population, gives \$4,60 to each person. Massachusetts gives \$9,07; Rhode Island \$10,25; Con-necticut \$6,83; Ohio \$5,04; Hilmois \$5, 70; New Jersey \$4,32; California \$4,50; Maine \$1,80; Michigan \$1,57; New Hampshire \$3,07; Vermont \$1,12; Del-aware \$3,23; Maryland \$4,02; Indiana \$2,41. According to these ratios, Rhode Island is richer per capita than any other State in the Union, or, in other words, capital there is more remunera-tive and wealth more accumulated.
