The Prize Fight in Berks County. The New York Herald gives the follow ing account of the tries fight which took place in Berks county on Tuesday mornwilliam Parkinson is a Welshman, and a puddler by profession. He worked in an iron foundry at Tamaqua, Pa. He is thirty-four years of age, five feet three and a half inches in height, and welghed one hundred and eleven and a half pounds. It is stated this Parkinson has fought several times in the English ring, and left a good record behind him for gameness and good behavior. His battles in the Old Country were with White, McNulty, Tibbits, Mason and Bedworth, of Dudley, the latter being for £50 as side. He says that he beat all his men, with the exception of White, with whom he made a draw, the police having interfered and put a stop to the affair, while the tide of victory was flowing in his favor. Parkinson came to this country about four years ago, and tired hard to get a match with Johnny Hickey, but was unsuccessful. He then endeavored to get a fight with Keating, but was again disappointed. He then made overtures to Dlok Hollywood but the little type-sticker could not be conxed into a match. After offering to fight any one hundred and twelve pound man in the country without finding a customer, Park-THE MEN. type-sticker could not be coaxed into a match. After offering to fight any one hundred and twelve pound man in the country without finding a customer, Parkinson went to the coal regions of Pennsylvania, where he had been employed quietly until the day of the fight between Sam Collver and Johnny McGlade, when, meeting with Kelley on that occasion and expressing a desire to appear once more in the prize ring, a match was made between them on the spot, and he immediately went into training at Pottsville, under the mentorship of Ed. Williams, the pedestrian, who to his credit, brought Parkinson to the scratch in most capital condition.

Thomas Kelly is a native of St. John, New Brunswick, and has lived in Philadelphia for the last eight years. He is five feet five inches in height, and weighed on hundred and nine and one-half pounds. He had fought twice previously. His first fight was with Adam Erfort, twenty-seven rounds, one hour and twenty-seven minutes, in 1865, under the assumed name of the sevent was the second under utes, in 1885, under the assumed name of "Hastings' Kid," and his second under that of "Buckshot," thirty rounds in one that of "Buckshot, that you matches easily.

Kelly is twenty-three years old. He was trained by Mike Carr, at Point Breeze, Philadelphia, and was brought to the scratch in as fine condition as ever man ap-

scratch in as fine condition as ever man appeared in the ring.

THE FIGHT.

As the men faced each other and placed themselves in fighting attitude the peculiar positions were very striking. Parkinson had a very neat and stylish attitude, with great elasticity of movement in the lower extremities. He held his hands well up, with his elbows cloeto his sides, and moved about with a springy and buoyant grace. Kelly, on the other hand, presented a grotesque attitude. His left shoulder was raised in such an ungainly manner that it concealed nearly the whole of the left side of his head. His left hand he held high and far extended, with his right lying on his far extended, with his right lying on his breast. He came up grinning savagely, and seemed determined to commence operations seemed determines becommended at once. Parkinson made feint and stepped back, Kelly following quickly, and soon they both let go their left hands at the face, but both were short. Parkinson then stepped away, but being followed closely again made another feint, though before he got away Kelly was with him, and they coutered together with their left hands, Kelly was mouth, drawing first blood, or the mouth, drawing first blood, getting on the mouth, drawing first blood Parkinson on the forehead. Kelly continu getting on the mouta, travailing and second partial pa ade him reel. Kelly, followed him and received a left-hander on the up and received a left-hander on the nose; but he in return planted his left again on Parkinson's mouth, drawing more blood. Kelly also missed his left and right at the head, while Parkinson seemed con fused in his endeavors to get away. An overreaching right hander of Kelly's, which passed over Parkinson's head, brought them to close quarters, when Parkinson seized Kelly by the left leg, just above the knee, on the inside, and held on there until the referee was appealed to with cries of the referee was appealed to with cries of "foul." Parkinson then slipped his hand further up and held Kelly by the breeches, andeavoring to throw him. Kelly did not urther up and neid Keny of andenvoring to throw him. Kelly did not struggle for the fall, but gathering his truggle for the fall, but gathering his truggle hander in the strongth planted a heavy left hander in the ribs, and was then thrown, Parkinson falling on him. Foul was claimed by thoseconds of Kelly, and the referee promptly decided that Kelly had won the fight. Great confusion then ensued, the partisans of Kelly rushing into the ring and congratulating, him on his easy vistory, while Parkinson's friends were calling on the referee to have the ring cleared and let the fight go on. have the ring cleared and letthe fight go on. Lazarus then went over and took down the colors, while the Parkinson men were ex-postulating with the referee for a reversion of his decision. This, however, that gentle-man would not do, and so the affair ended, man would not do, and so the affair ended, and the crowd began to disperse. There is no doubt that the foul act of Parkinson was premeditated. A man with his experience in mistake; and the presumption is, that finding himself overmatched he adopted this system of bringing to an early close a buttle that must have terminated disastrously to him. The round lasted two minutes, and a more dashing first round has seldom been witnessed in the prize ring. Parkinson witnessed in the prize ring. Parkinson seems to have lost all the force he is said to seems to have lost all the force he is said to have possessed in his youthful fights, as he could not punish his antagonist. On the other hand, Kelly is a heavy hitter with both hands; and as he seems to have plenty of pluck, he will be found a hard customer for the best of the feather weights. The old
