That on and after the first day of July, 1868, eight hours of labor between the rising and setting of the sun, shall be deemed and hold to be a legal day's work in all eases of hor and service by the day, when there is no contract or agreement to the contract. Provided, The pay be the same as trary. Provided, The pay be the same as in ten hours.

SEC. 2. This act shall not apply to, or in any way affect, farm or agricultural labor or service by the year, mouth or week; nor shall any person be prevented by anything horein contained, from working as many hours overwork, or extra work as he or she may see fit, the compensation to be agreed upon between the employer and the employer. ployee.

SEC. 3. All other acts or parts of acts relating to the hours of labor which shall constitute a day's work in this State are repealed.


