JAMES E. SULLIVAN, SECRETARY A. A. U., DIES IN NEW YORK

Was America's Best Posted Athletic Authority—Died Just Before Noon of Complication of Diseases.

NEW YORK, Sept. 15.—James E. Sullivan, secretary-treasurer of the Amateur Athletic Union, and one of the most widely known sporting authorities in America, died here shortly before noon today.

Sullivan was operated on Monday evening for a condition of internal and stomach trouble, and passed away at his home at 100 West 11th street, New York, after a brief illness.
