

BRUMBAUGH GIVES PLEDGE OF SERVICE TO VAST CROWDS

Audience at Altoona Overflows Theatre and Cheers Candidate, Who Again Asserts His Independence.

ALTOONA, Pa., Sept. 25.—Doctor Brumbaugh, Republican candidate for Governor, talking to 1500 persons in a theatre at Altoona last night.

Hundreds clamored for admission after the doors had been closed, and Doctor Brumbaugh, Senator Penrose, ex-Congressman Daniel Latham and J. D. Hicks, and Frank B. McClain, candidate for Lieutenant Governor, addressed an overflow meeting on the street.

Senator Penrose did not reach Altoona until late and did not participate in the evening tendered Doctor Brumbaugh by the citizens of Blair County, the home county of the Republican candidate for Governor in the afternoon.

Doctor Brumbaugh said that for 160 years his ancestors had tilled the soil of Pennsylvania, obeyed the laws of the State and tried to live useful lives. He said he was proud to be one of these people and to be an expression of them. He was a candidate who was not pledged to a single man but to the whole Commonwealth. He had no political experience, no financial support and no pledge save that of service to the public.

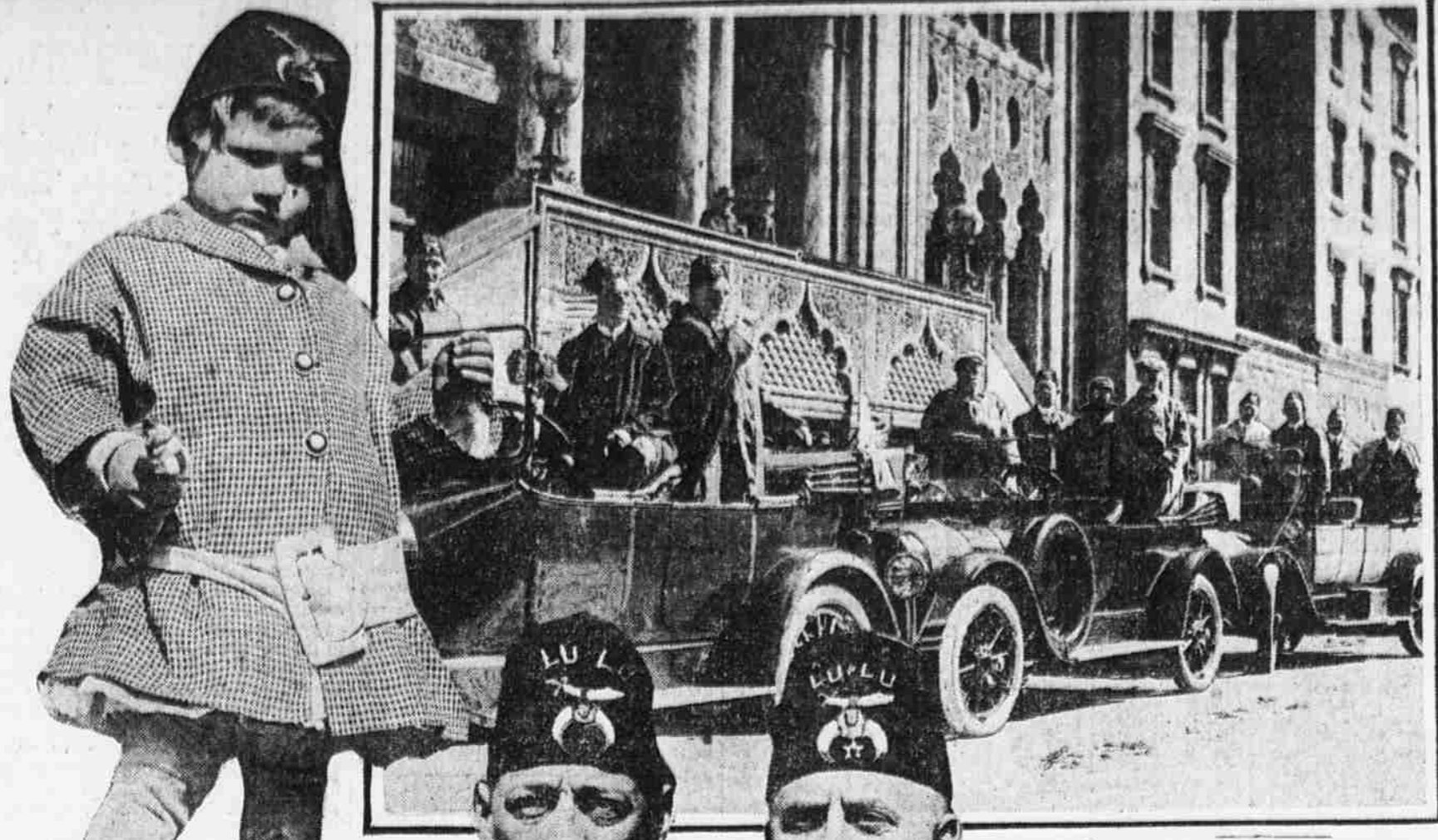
