BERLIN, Oct. 29.—Because of heavy losses, Belgian forces in Neuport were compelled to retire, according to a statement issued at the War Office early today.

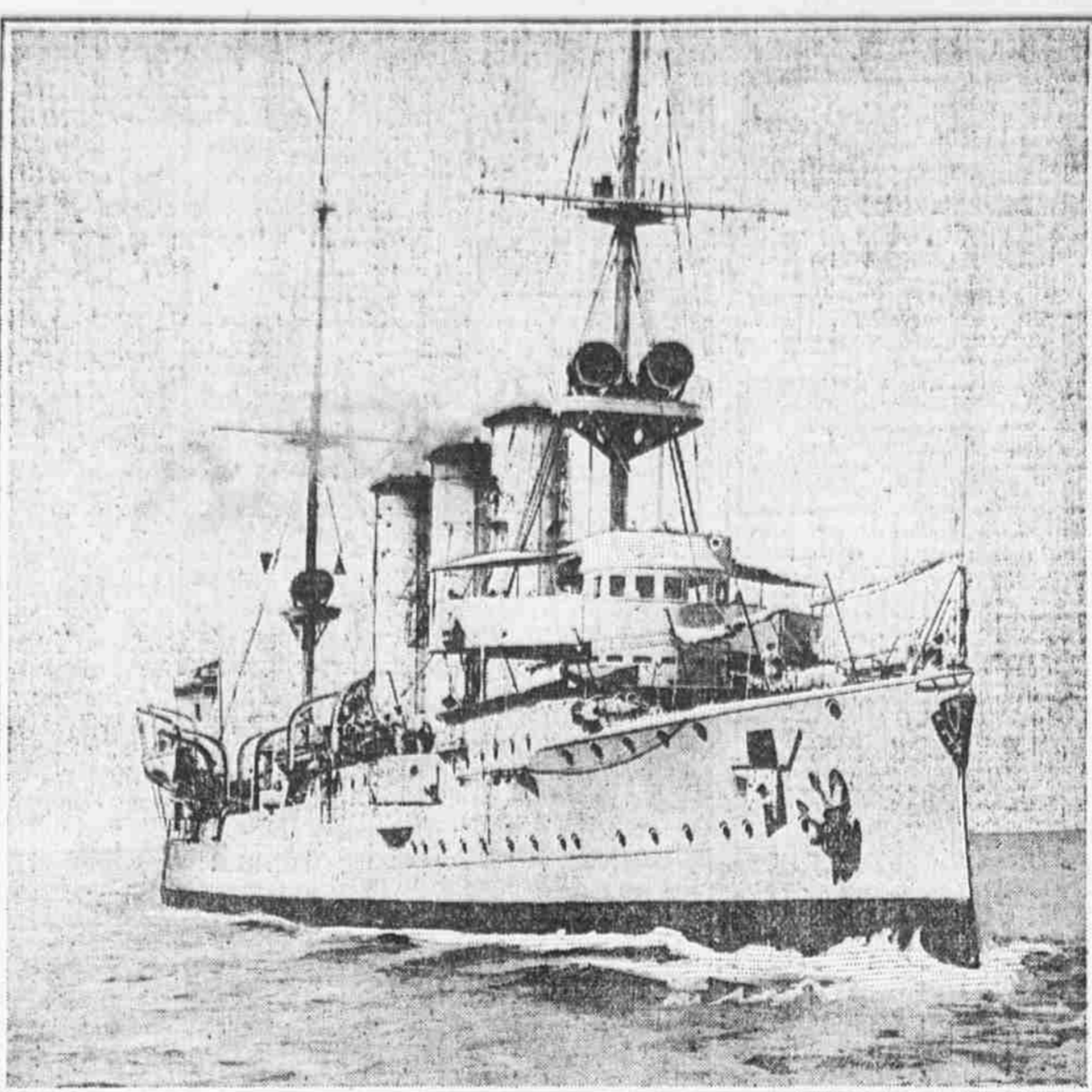

WAR MOVES SHOW GERMANS PLAN DRIVE TO BOULOGNE

Advance on Calais and Dunkirk Apparently Abandoned for Present—Kaiser's Forces Struggle in Net of Canals.

The drive of the Germans in Belgium, toward Calais and Dunkirk apparently has been diverted and it now seems to be their intention to push directly on to Boulogne, further to the south, instead.

PARIS, Oct. 29.—A small contingent of Germans have succeeded, after terrible devastation in their ranks, in crossing the Yser, but instead of being an advantage to them it is rather a danger, as may be shown before long.

It is not sufficient in such ground to have crossed a river, stream or canal, for the country is nothing but a network of these. An army must avoid having its back up against one of these streams.

As it now is, the Germans everywhere are in danger of being driven into the canals or waterways, and losing all their men and guns. If they expect to be able to carry on a warfare of trenches there, as they did for a month in the valley of the Aene, they will again be mistaken.

It was at Boulogne that Napoleon waited for an opportunity which never came to invade England and the advance on and the taking of that town is the scheme which naturally appeals to the Kaiser.

Monday afternoon events took a much more favorable turn. The German advance failed to follow up their early successes, and have been again driven back across the Yser.
