

an unpopular neutrality or will seize the opportunity to end once for all Turkey in Europe as a nation. The officials here believe that both Rumania and Bulgaria will strike against Turkey in the immediate future.

BLOWS BY TURKEY. The reports received here of the Turkish activity are, for the present, confined to the following:

Two destroyers, flying the Turkish flag, followed the outer harbor at Odessa, sinking a Russian merchant steamer.

The Turkish cruiser Breslau brought from Germany a number of officers and crew to the harbor of Theodosia, Caucasus, and sent two officers ashore to demand the surrender of the city.

The Russian Government has refused the demand. The Breslau then bombarded the outer docks, doing considerable damage and killing one soldier.

The Turkish cruiser Hamidieh appeared off Novorossiysk and immediately afterwards the Turkish Consul-General threatened that the city would surrender to the warship. He was arrested and immediately afterwards the warship withdrew.

RUSSIANS IN GLEE. News that Turkey actually had entered the war was made public in this city in special editions of the newspapers.

Immediately afterward a patriotic demonstration was started that eclipsed anything seen here since the opening of the war.

It is declared at the War Office that Germany has called on Turkey in the hope that a demonstration by the Turkish army and navy will relieve the pressure on the allied armies in Gallia and along the East Prussian border.

It was reported that the Turkish Charge d'Affaires in Petrograd, was dining when news was taken to him that Turkish warships had attacked Russian ports.
