# "OUR TURN NEXT" IF GERMANS WIN, SAYS J. R. DREXEL

American Back From Europe Declares Kaiser Has Army of 300,000 in U.S. Tells of Atrocities.

NEW YORK, Nov. 21 .- "Germany has 00,000 officers and men in this country already, and if she wins the present war, ft will be our turn next."

This statement was made by John R. Drexel, of this city and formerly of Philadelphia, when he returned from Europe last night on the White Star liner Adriatic. He has spent most of the last two months in Vichy, France, and declared he had a splendid opportunity to see the German fighting machine at work.

It is a wonderful machine, and is be ing very cleverly handled by the most astute group of men in the world, the German General Staff," he continued. "It is up to this Government to take immediate steps to increase the strength of our standing army and to double our fleet.
