Another meeting was held at the home of Mrs. E. T. Stotesbury yesterday for the purpose of devising means of raising money with which to buy clothing and food for Philadelphia's poor. Various subcommittees were appointed to make a canvase in an effort to obtain money and clothing.

As soon as the organization of the home relief department on a larger scale has been completed, the funds now on hand will be used to relieve the more urrent cases that are under advisement. Mr. and Mrs. Stotesbury were in conference with Mayor and Mrs. Stankenburg in the Mayor's office yesterday. No announcement was made after the conference, but the fact that R. M. Little, secretary of the Society for Organizing Charity, was present, gave foundation for the belief that new proposals for the city's participation in relief work were under consideration.
