LONDON, Dec. 5.—In a casualty list made public tonight Captain the Hon. Arthur Annesley, of the 10th Hussars, is reported among the killed.

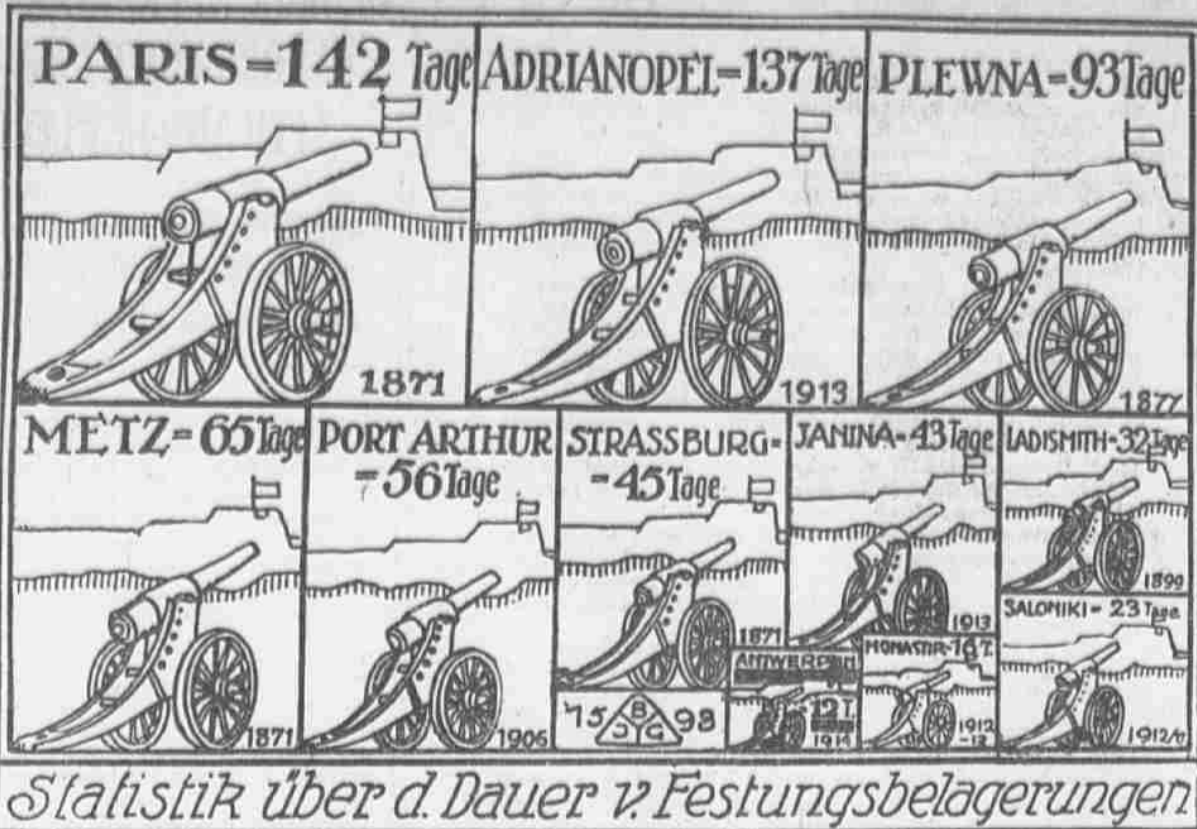
