#### BUSINESS BODIES OF NORTHERN END FOR TAYLOR PLAN

Three Mass-meetings Condemn Costello Bill and Strongly Support Transit Director.

Three more business men's organizations in the northern part of the city decided at enthusiastic meetings last night to support the Taylor transit system, and, to show that they were sinpere, adopted resolutions condemning the. Costello bill, which, they said, would oply prove an obstacle to the work already done by the Director of City Transit.

The meetings were held at Odd Fellows' Hall, Chelten and Ogontz avenues. Germantows; Broad street and Windrim avenue, under the auspices of the Logan Improvement League, and at the Lowell Public School Annex, under the auspices of the Olney Improvement Association.

Director Taylor addressed the Germantown meeting, and showed with figures and facts that the residents of that section could save more money than those of any other part of the city by the proposed high-speed system.

DIRECTOR TAYLOR'S SPEECH Mr. Taylor said in part:

Fellow-citizens, the time has come for the people of Philadelphia to get together and insist upon the immediate construction of such high-speed lines as will adequately serve all of the various districts of the city and the people resident therein.

"Prompt, aggressive and united action on the part of the people will lead City Councils to take the only remaining steps which are necessary to promptly establish the high-speed lines and to enable the construction thereof to be commenced early in 1915.

"First. City Councils should call a special election enabling the people to authorize an increase in the city's indebtedness ne contracts can be let. This special election should be authorized by City Councils without delay to enable the people to express their will with relation to transit development. The people should insist upon this opportunity being given them to so express their will forthwith. This is a right which I believe you are entitled to and which must be accorded to you promptly if you emphatically demand it.

"As soon as these three steps are taken by City Councils, the election is held, the necessary approval of the Public Service Commission is secured and Councils have appropriated the money for construction, blds will be invited, contracts awarded and construction will be started without

any delay whatever.

"Therefore, the immediate establishment of rapid transit facilities in Philadelphia depends entirely upon present action by your representatives in City Councils.
"This action is what we want: furthermore, this action is what I am asking you secure in your own interest by united and aggressive action.

Mr. Taylor then explained the proposed high-speed system in detail and told of the benefits which it would bring to the

WHOLE CITY TO BENEFIT. Continuing, the Director said:

"Every section of the city will be made available to every other section of the city, quickly, cheaply and conveniently. and families will be enabled to establish permanent homes in East Germantown from which every member of the family

can reach every place of employment in the city quickly and for 5 cents.

"As to your local requirements I shall speak particularly of the district bounded on the north by City Line, on the south by Olney avenue, on the east by Old York road and on the weat by Stenton avenue, Chew and Haines streets.

"The population of this district in 1912 was 14,200.

was 14,200.

"On an average 10,500 passengers travel daily within, out of, and into this section on the atreet cars.

"The passengers who travel into and out of your section will be saved 220,000 hours per year, which, valued at 15 cents per hour, would equal \$52,000 per year.

"These discriminations against East Germantown are absolutely unjustifiable, and they must be eliminated.

"You citizens of East Germantown know what you want and what you want

know what you want and what you are entitled to.
"You want to be connected up with

every other section of the city by the high-speed system, with free transfers on existing and future surface lines and ad-ditional surface lines, including a new surface line on Chew street, and later a new surface line on Stenton avenue, for one 5-cent fare.

PROMPT ACTION IMPERATIVE. "You want City Councils to act immediately and permit the people to vote on the necessary increase of the city's indebtedness to provide the money for the construction of the high-speed system. "You want the unjustifiable discrimination in rates of fare charged to people traveling between your district and other important districts of the city eliminated

without further delay. "You want to be relieved of the discomfort, inconvenience and waste of time which you are suffering from in traveling
