SIR THOMAS KELLY-KENNY Irish Soldier Commanded Division in South African War.

LONDON, Dec. 26. - General Sir Thomas Kelly-Kenny died at his home at Hove, Sussex, today. He was 74 years old and was retired from service In 1997.

General Kelly-Kenny, an Irish soldier of County Clare, was born February 27, 1840, and entered the army in 1858. He served in China and Abyssinia and gained a reputation as a divisional commander in the South African war. Despite his military duties, General Kelly-Kenny took a deep interest in Irish af-fairs and was a Justice of the Peace of County Clare.

## MRS. CHARLOTTE B. WILBOUR

Founder of Sorosis and Woman Suf-

frage Worker, NEW YORK, Dec. M .- Mrs. Charlotte Besbs Wilbour, a co-worker with Susan B. Anthony for woman suffrage and a founder of Sorosis, the first women's club in this country, died Thursday in her \$3d year. She was the widow of Charles El. Wilbour, the eminent Egyptologist, Mrs. Wilbour was associated with Susan B. Anthony in getting up the monster petition for freeing the slaves before the Civil War. She was president of Phalo, the woman's literary society, and vice president of the Mozart Musical Society.

### MICHAEL TELLER

Veteran Hotelman Entertained Thousands of Stage Folk.

Michael Teller, 75 years old, proprietor of the Teller Theatrical Hotel, 701 Vine street, and a veteran of the Civil War. died last night in his apartments at the hotel.

His autographed pictures of old-time stage favorites is considered a rare col-lection, of which he had often boasted. He is survived by his widow and daughter, Miss Eather Teller. Dr. William H. Teller, of this city, is a cousin.


