

SHIPPERS RESENT RIBBEL ON FACILITIES AND DEPTH OF PORT

Jealousy of Rivals Responsible for Dissemination of False Statements About Channel, Experts Say.

Congressman J. Hampton Moore must have been misinformed when he declared that the Government collars were unable to get at this port because of the shallow-water of the Delaware River channel.

The story that the coller Protheus provided here on his first trip is branded as untrue by the pilot who took the vessel down the river after she had been towed.

It is just another of those lies about the port which should not be dignified by a reply, one shipping man said today.

The reports that the Delaware channel was not deep enough for collars was put in circulation shortly after J. H. Weaver & Co., of this city, had obtained a contract for the shipment of 200,000 tons of steel to the Pacific coast for the use of the Navy Department.

COAL OPERATORS BLAMED. Although J. H. Weaver & Co. refuse to make any statement, there is a rumor that the coller circles that the agitation against the port of Philadelphia is largely due to the influence of some Virginia coal operators.

The Virginia operators, it is said, employed a virtual monopoly of the coal business, part of which has recently been given to the local company at a saving of approximately \$125,000 to the Government.

PILOTS DEFEND PORT. In discussing the subject, J. S. W. Holm, president of the Maritime Exchange, said: "Several months ago, when J. H. Weaver & Co. contemplated the shipment of coal by collars, they made inquiries as to the depth that it was safe to load.

They were assured by all that have knowledge of river conditions that the vessels could be loaded and taken to sea safely. All the vessels that have left here on this contract have been taken to sea safely, and we have the assurance of the pilots that there was not the slightest difficulty in conducting them to the mouth of the river.

GREAT TUNNEL AIDS TRAFFIC. Seven Miles of Grade Displaced in Transcontinental Route.

BEATTLE, Wash., Jan. 14.—The Snohomish Pass tunnel of the Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul Railroad, which will be opened for traffic tomorrow, is a trifle less than two miles long. It will displace more than seven miles of heavy grades on the transcontinental route.
