Yesterday Morning

"THY KINGDOM COME"

...please from the Lord's Prayer, "Thy Kingdom Come." ...Thy Kingdom Come means to have a part in the greatest business in which man can be engaged. It means to go into partnership with God in the work of saving the world. "Thy Kingdom Come." It is as clear in the sentence which immediately follows, "Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven."

THE MEANING OF PRAYER.

...when you pray "Thy Kingdom Come" that means to want the kingdom of our Lord no matter what it costs, what sacrifice, what hard work, what sacrifice. To pray "Thy Kingdom Come" means that we want the Bible translated into every tongue; it means to have churches and schoolhouses everywhere; it means to share the burden of the world's sin and expenses.

MAN WHO TRULY PRAYS.

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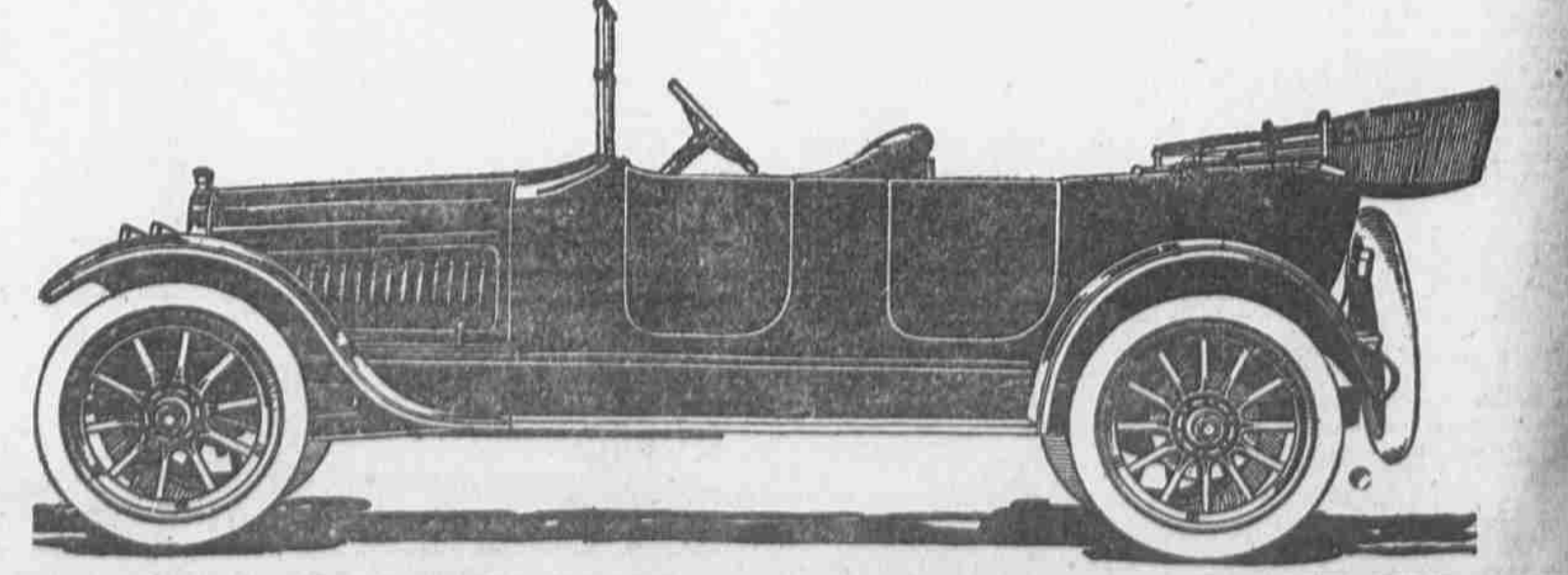
