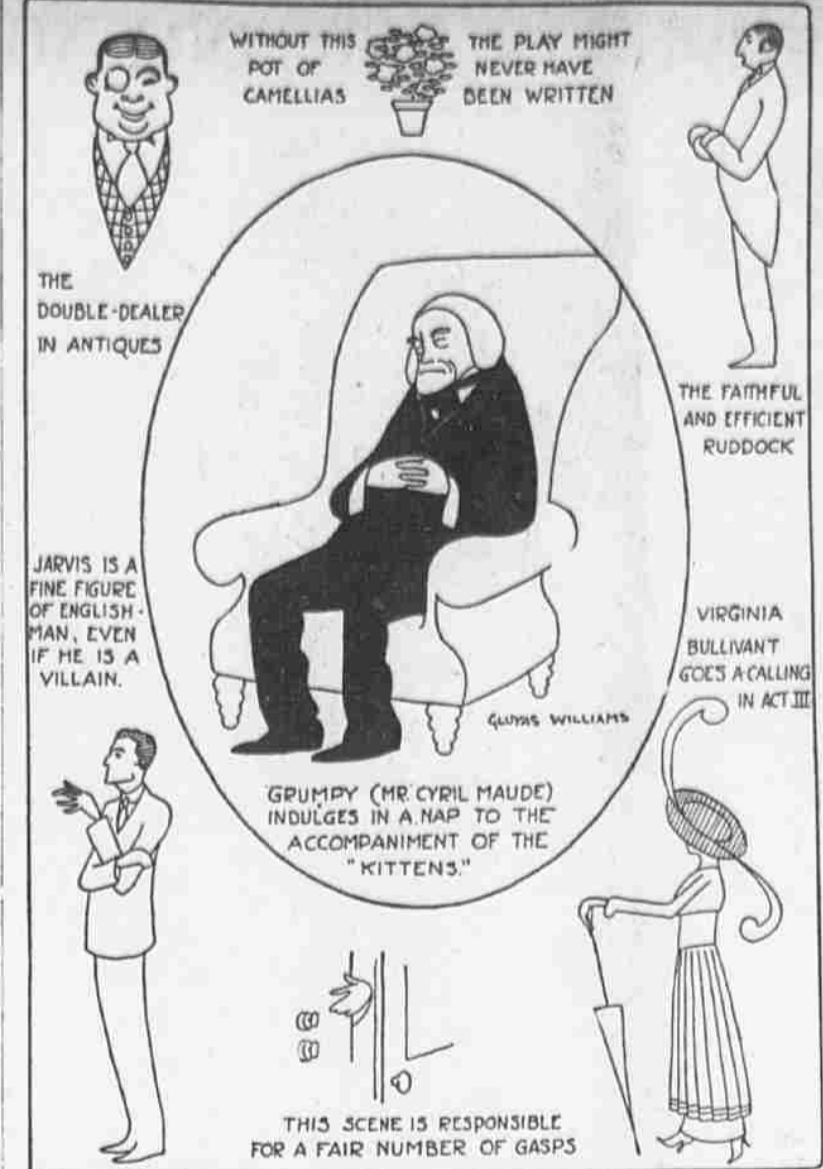

An honorary medical adviser to the Chinese Government and recipient of decorations from the rulers of great nations is now in Philadelphia for a short visit. He is Dr. Dugald Christie, of Edinburgh, Scotland, who is staying with his brother, Doctor Christie, of 221 North 22d street.

speaking of China from the political point of view, the Doctor said: "The Government is now in the hands of a strong man who is in sympathy with Western ideas and advancement. Particularly is he interested in the practice of medicine as carried on in these parts of the world. The feeling was, at the time the republic was formed, that the people were not ready for it, but they have adjusted themselves to it and promise to make a great nation. The Chinese are easily governed if the theory of the government is 'right is might'." He is a peaceable fellow and very honest.
