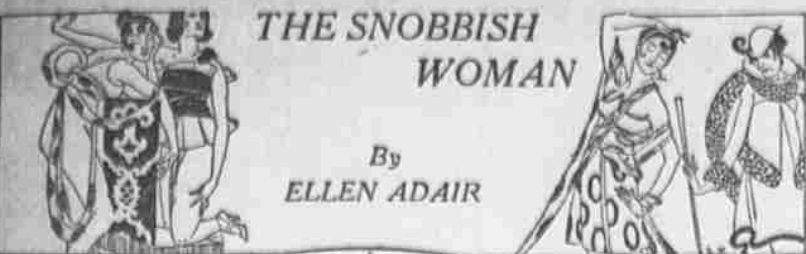

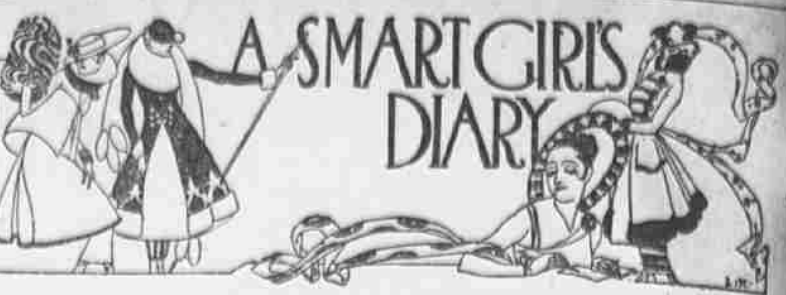

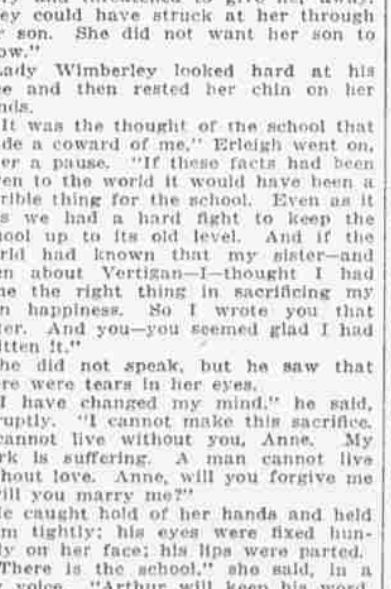
GERMAN COMMANDER KILLED
