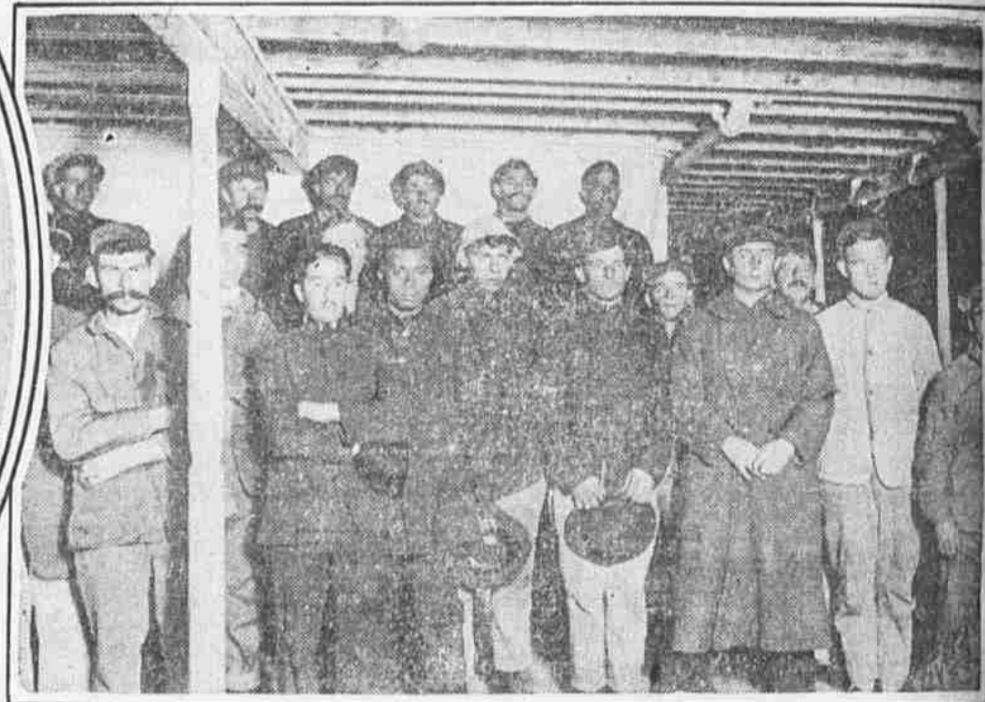


SHE WON THREE PRIZES WITH THESE DOLLS

New York lawyer whose wife has sued for divorce after "the other woman" had poisoned her two children by him.

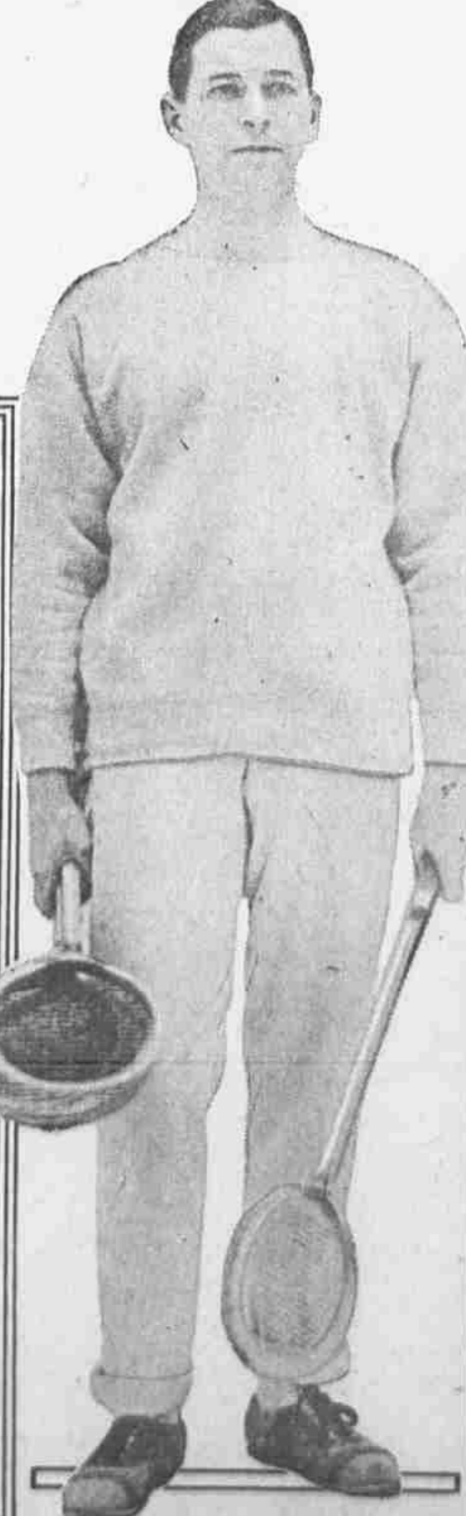


JOSEPH W. WEAR
