

CAMPAIN FOR MISSION FUND IN REFORMED CHURCH

\$250,000 to Be Collected to Pay Debt and Enlarge Work in Japan and China.

A campaign of unusual interest is now on in the Reformed Church in the United States for the raising of the Prince of Peace fund of \$250,000, from February 3 to 15, inclusive.

One hundred and twenty-one community groups, consisting of pastors and laymen, have been appointed throughout the United States to solicit contributions from the 12,000 communicant members.

Advance pledges have been received at the board's headquarters, Reformed Church Building, this city, amounting to about \$25,000.

The widow of the Rev. Clement Z. Warner, D. D., who was for many years president of the Board of Foreign Missions and the father of the famous Peace Commission of 1878 in the Reformed Church, has made a contribution of \$500 to the Prince of Peace fund.

Thirty men in Philadelphia are at work in soliciting \$25,000 from the membership in this city.

No other movement has so stirred the entire denomination like this Prince of Peace fund campaign.

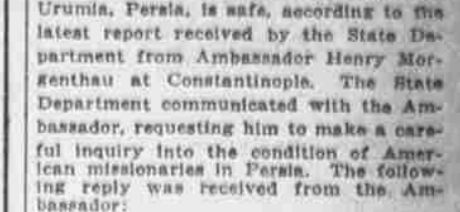
