He was 62 years old, and the son of the late Dr. David Flavel Woods. He was a member of the University and the Philadelphia Racquet clubs. His mother, who before her marriage was Miss Mary M. Husbands, is sole survivor.

Dr. Paul P. Allen, a recent graduate of the University of Pennsylvania, died at his home in Chambersburg, Pa., from pneumonia. Several years ago he married Miss Gertrude Wheeler, the daughter of C.
