TORPEDO SINKS BRITISH VESSEL CLOSE TO COAST

Oakby Torpedoed Off Folkstone — Ship Sunk Near Eastbourne Believed Submarine's Prey.

German Claim of Torpedoing of British Transport Off Beachy Head Denied in London — Collier Branksome Chine Believed Lost.

LONDON, Feb. 24. An unidentified vessel of about 2000 tons sank seven miles from shore off the pier at Eastbourne, this afternoon, according to a dispatch here from the Eastbourne Gazette.

DOVER, Eng., Feb. 24. The British steamship Oakby, of West Hartlepool, was torpedoed and sunk by a German submarine in the English Channel off Folkstone today.

The Oakby was a vessel of 3000 tons and carried a crew of between 20 and 30 men.

Some members of the crew of the Oakby were landed at Ramsgate by fishing smacks which went to their rescue when the boat was blown up.

A dispatch from Stockholm says: "The Swedish steamer Specia has been sunk by a mine in the North Sea."

BERLIN, Feb. 24. The English transport No. 192 has been sunk by a German submarine off Beachy Head, in the English Channel, it was officially announced here today.

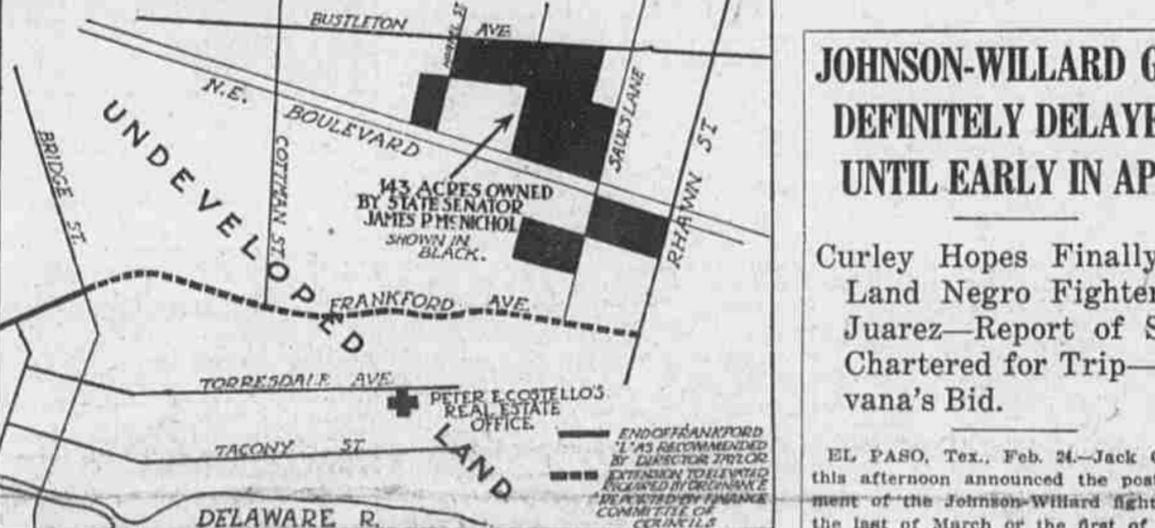
