



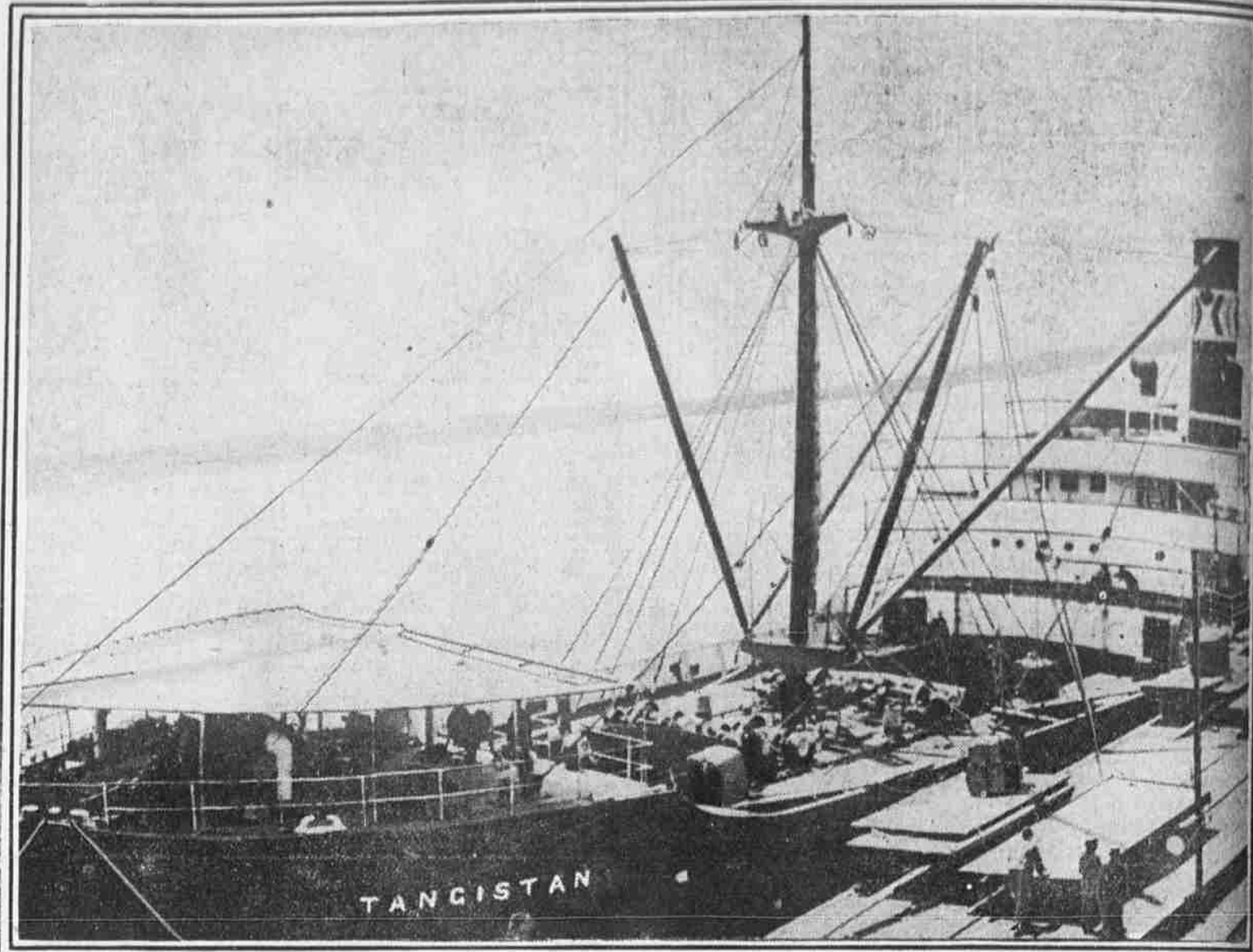

Taken on occasion of the recent papal mass when 60,000 persons gathered to pray for peace in Europe.



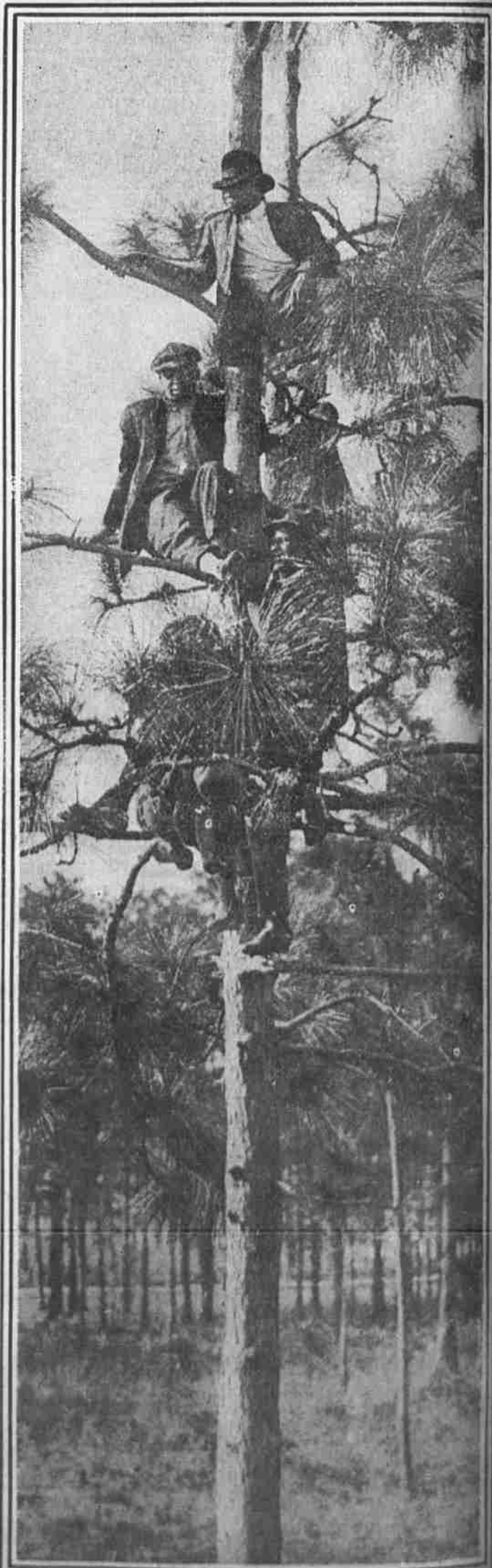
ONLY ONE OF HER CREW SURVIVED SUBMARINE ATTACK

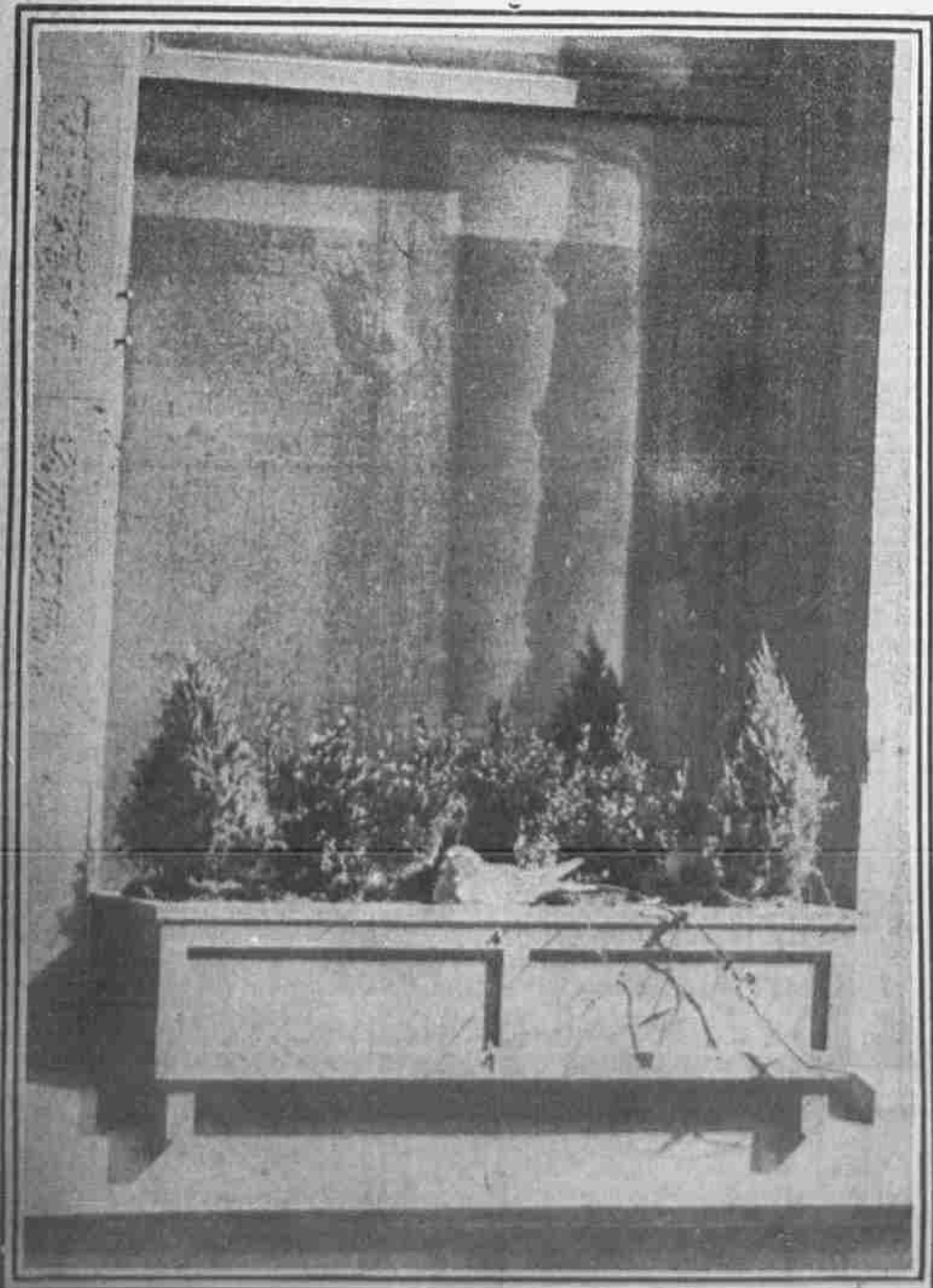
AND HERE IS "TONY" BIDDLE STRIDING ALONG
