Friedens Five Plays Hancock

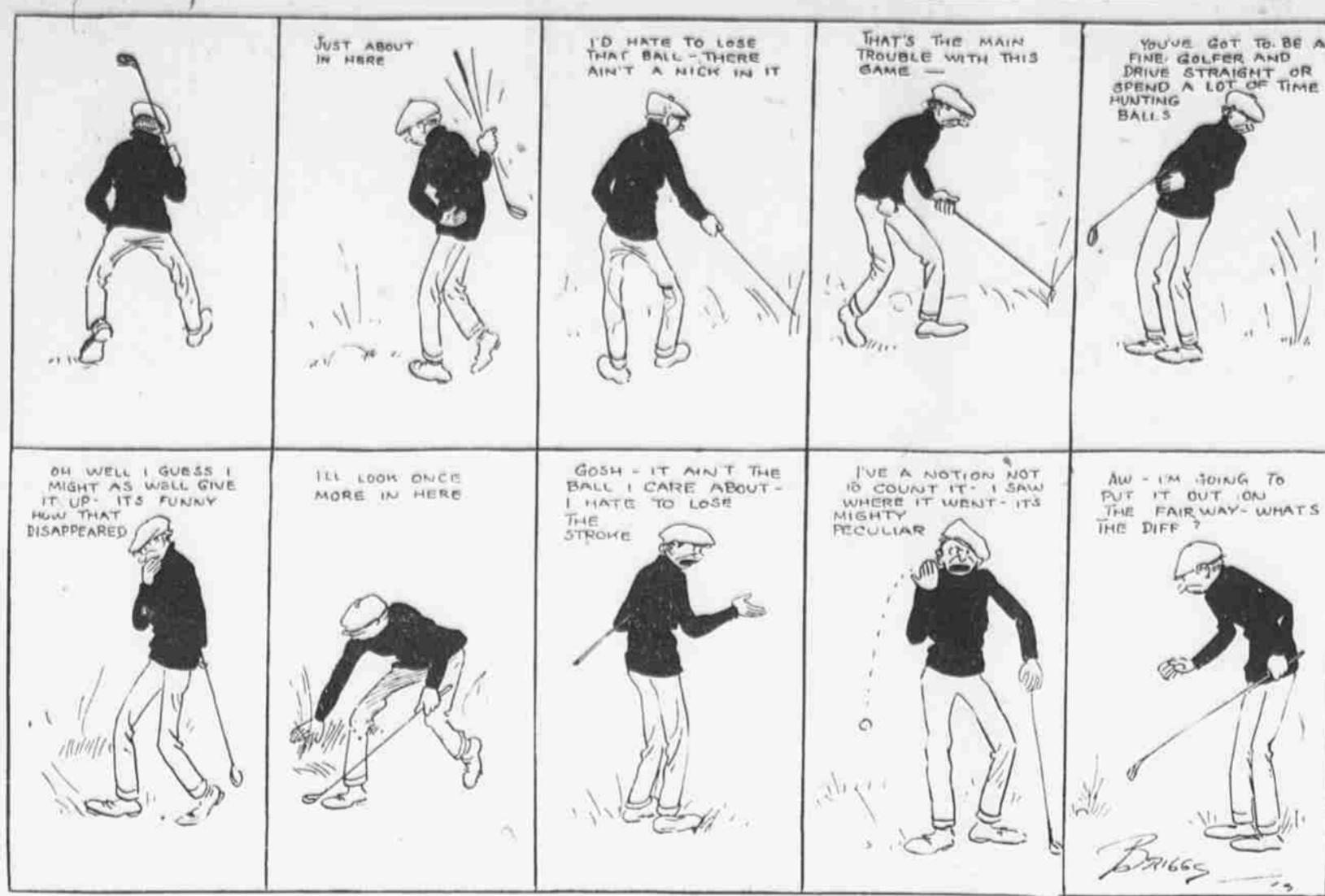
