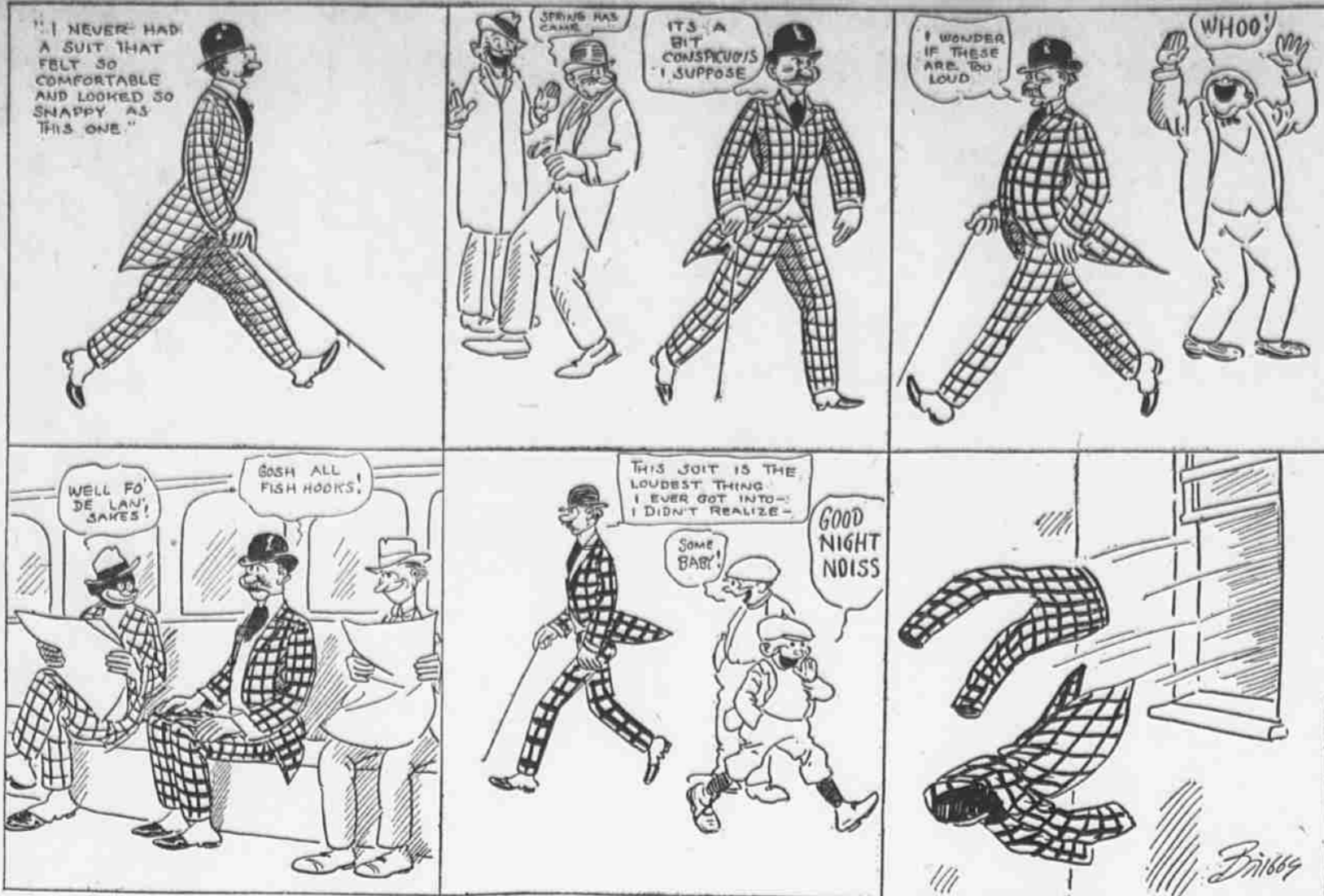

WOMEN ORGANIZE CHRISTIAN LEAGUE

Three Hundred Plan Co-operation in Religious Work Among Female Employees.

A permanent organization of Christian business women, to be known as the Business Women's League of Philadelphia, is one of the outgrowths of the "Bible" Sunday campaign. Definite plans for the establishment of such a league were made at a meeting in Westminster Hall last night. It is proposed to have club headquarters to accommodate about 200 girls and women, and the members are to co-operate to carry on religious work among the female employees of downtown offices, stores and other places. There are about 700 names of prospective members listed already.

There were about 300 women present at last night's meeting. Addresses were made in the interests of the movement by Mrs. E. Boyd Weissel and Mrs. Edwin C. Green, who had charge of the work for the local committee among business women during the campaign. It is planned to have the club rooms equipped with cooking utensils and meals will be served the working girls at the noon hour. Rooms will also be set aside for prayer meetings and Bible classes for groups representing the workers from different stores, firms and office buildings.

Tonight, in the Baptist Temple, Broad and Berks streets, a three-day Sunday school revival is to be opened. The Rev. Dr. Russell H. Conwell, pastor of the Temple and president of Temple University, will preach, and J. Lincoln Hall, director of the choir for the tabernacle meetings, will lead a chorus of about 200 persons in singing revival hymns.

It has been definitely announced in Paterson that Sunday's campaign in that city will be officially opened on Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock. It had been the original plan to begin the campaign on Sunday morning, but, because the co-operating Protestant churches were anxious to hold their usual Easter programs on Sunday morning, the evangelist has consented to postpone the official opening until the afternoon when it will not interfere with the Easter services, and members of all the co-operating churches can attend. Mr. Sunday made this announcement through his assistant, the Rev. E. H. Emmett, after Mrs. G. A. Hobart, widow of a former Vice President of the United States, had made an appeal to him for 33 churches of the city.

LIKES "ZIP" OF BULLETS

For That Reason Shelly Quits European War for Mexican.

"I would rather fight in the Mexican war than in the European war. There is more excitement in exchanging bullets than with the combined armies on the other side. I'm off for Mexico, where you can hear a shot every second."

William A. Shelly, 22 years old, a native of Dallas, Tex., soldier of fortune and sailor, spoke these words today when he was released by the immigration authorities on the charge of coming to this port as a stowaway. Shelly arrived here on the British steamer, the *Palmas*, from Las Palmas, Canary Islands. Before the vessel, which carried a cargo of grain, left Las Palmas, he succeeded in hiding himself aboard the ship. He was discovered three days after the vessel was out at sea.

Captain Randall, of the Southgate, put Shelly to work in cleaning up the deck. When the vessel reached here he was turned over to the immigration authorities. As Shelly is an American citizen and had worked aboard the ship during the voyage he was released.

"I went aboard to fight with the Allies," said Shelly today, "but decided to return because I didn't find things across the ocean exciting enough for me. I like to hear bullets buzz around me. When I hear bullets it's a treat for me. It was different in Mexico. That's the place for bullets. You can hear bullets every second. I am going back to Mexico."

DELAWARE TAX WARNING

Collectors Told to Compel Delinquents to Pay.

WILMINGTON, Del., March 31.—Delinquent taxes must be paid, the New Castle County levy court has declared, and collectors who have been granted an extension of time for getting in taxes for 1914 and 1915 have been given to understand that no more extensions will be granted. The county's financial situation is such that the court will insist upon the collectors getting in the taxes if they are compelled to make levies upon properties or take other drastic measures. Even with the taxes collected, sufficient funds to meet the expenses of the county will not be available.
