

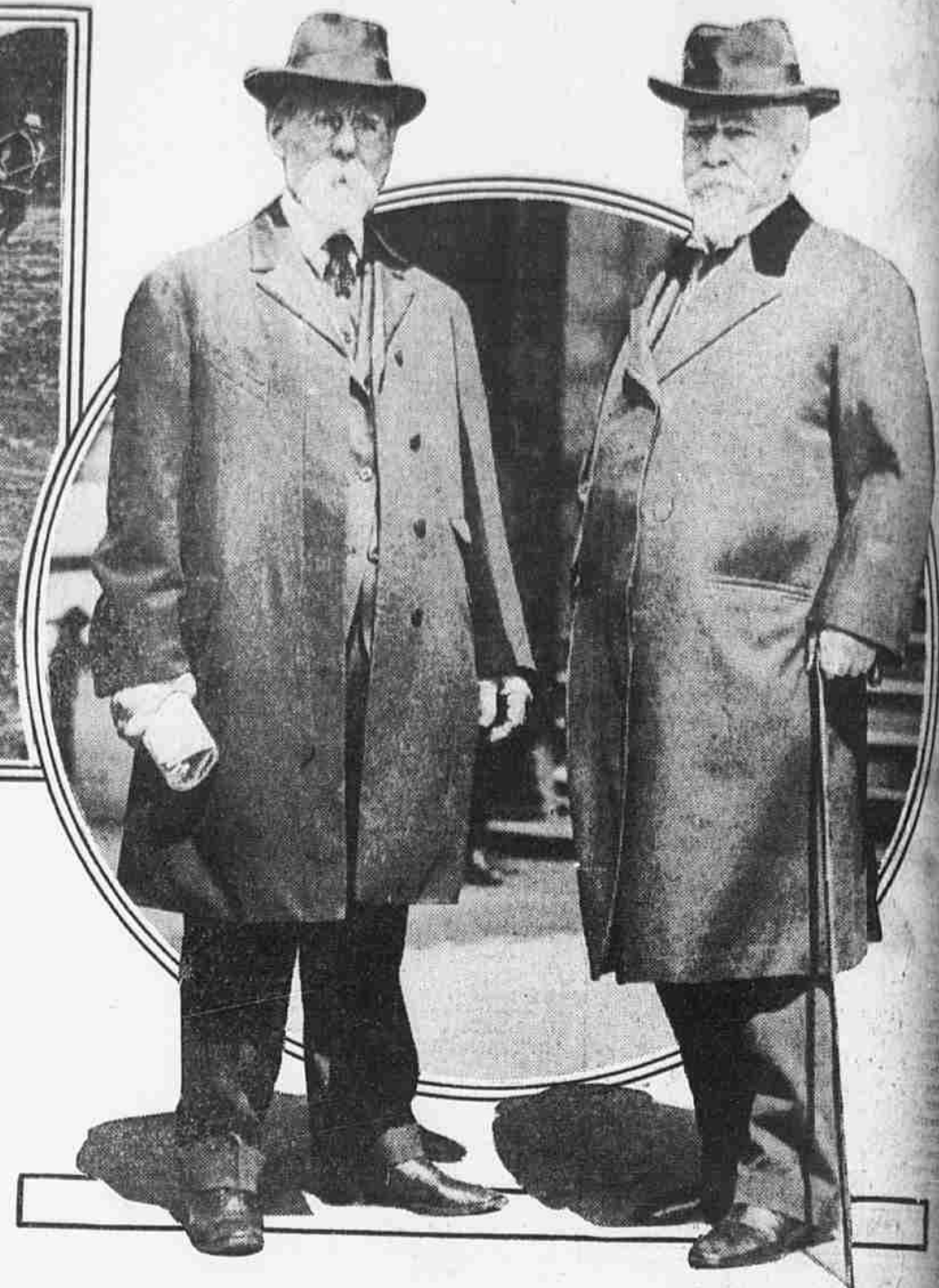


PERSONS AND SCENES IN DAY'S GRIST OF NEWS FROM HOME AND ABROAD AS CAUGHT BY THE CAMERA

KAISER AND HIS GENERALS AT VOUIZERS, FRANCE

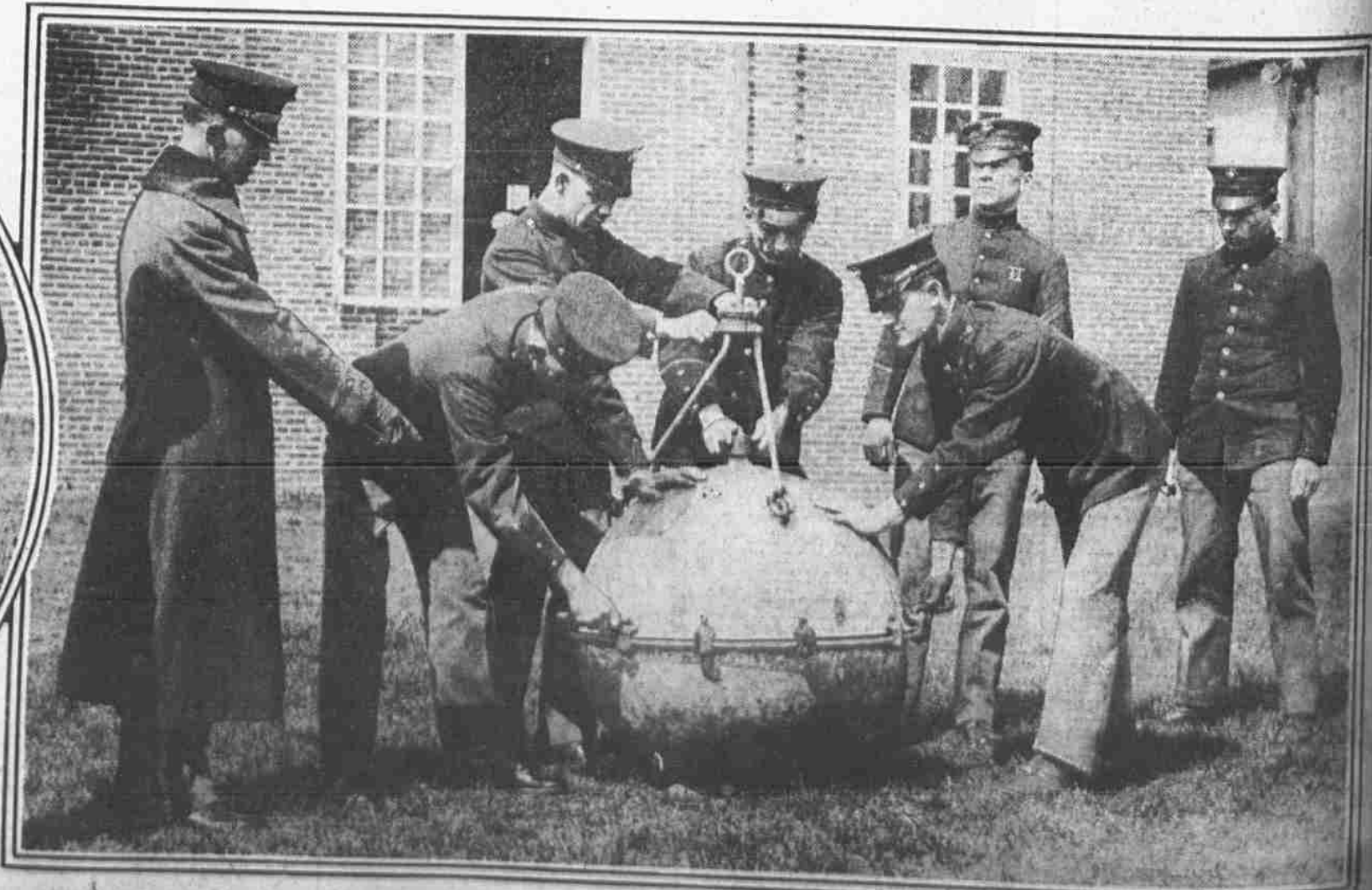
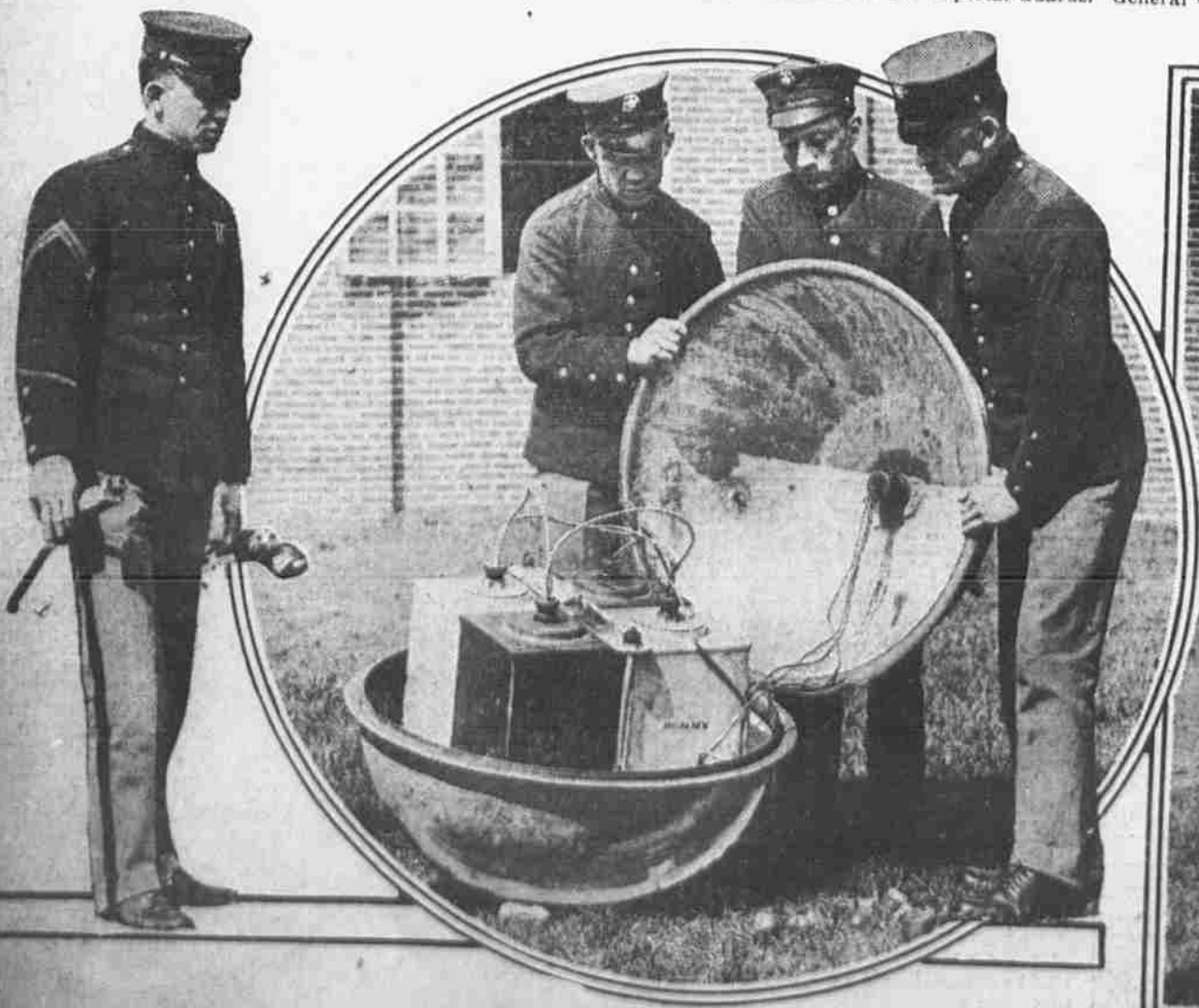

Under the direction of an officer, these members of the Marine Corps are assembling the parts and locking them preparatory to planting. The picture on the left shows the four "cans" of explosive with their electrical wiring. On the right is the mine locked and ready to be put in the water.
