WINTER WHEAT CROP WILL BE SMALLER

Forecast of Yield Is 619,000,000 Bushels, Against 684,990,000 Last Year.

WASHINGTON, April 22.—The average condition of winter wheat on April 1 was 84 per cent normal, against 84 1/2 per cent on April 1, 1914, and 81 1/2 per cent on April 1, 1913.

The Kansas crop report for April places the condition of wheat at 92 1/2 per cent of a full crop of 8,586,500 acres. Hessian fly has damaged early sown wheat.
