

PENROSE GIVES HEARTY SUPPORT TO LOAN BILL

Urges Voters to Approve Project for Improvement of Transit Facilities.

All speculation as to the attitude of the Republican Organization toward the \$5,000,000 transit loan to be voted upon at the special election next Thursday has been ended by the declaration of Senator Penrose that he will stand behind the loan even to the extent of casting a vote for it himself.

The formal statement issued by Senator Penrose is understood to have been prepared at the request of Transit Director A. Merritt Taylor, who was desirous of setting vague rumors that the Organization was preparing to refuse the loan at the polls and at the same time wished to arouse greater public interest in the special election.

Immediately after Senator Penrose came to the public sponsor of the loan Senator McNichol and Senator Vane took a similar stand. It was also made known that both Senator and Congressman Vane are urging a favorable vote for the loan in South Philadelphia.

The statement issued by Senator Penrose follows: "The forthcoming special election is an all-important step in establishing much needed and adequate rapid transit facilities in Philadelphia.

"I shall vote for the proposed \$5,000,000 increase in the city's indebtedness for the beginning of the construction of the Broad Street subway and of the Frankford Elevated.

"When the construction of the initial lines is once well under way the city will be committed in a practical manner to the completion of a system which will properly serve the necessities of the city in its entirety."

Members of the Committee of 1909, who will be committed in a practical manner to the loan, expressed themselves as delighted over the public stand taken by the Republican leaders. The success of the loan next Thursday now is assured.

Among others who followed the Organization leaders in stating that they will support the loan were Street Councilman Charles Seger and Charles Hall, chief clerk of Select Councils, and Congressman-elect George P. Darrow, of Germantown.

GOVERNOR TO NAME A "4TH" COMMITTEE

Joint Meeting With Councils Body to Plan National Celebration Next Week.

The appointment of a committee by Governor Brumbaugh to co-operate with Councils' Fourth of July Committee is expected to be made early next week, when a joint conference will be had to plan the national celebration of the Fourth of July in this city.

It has been decided that the first step will be an invitation to President Wilson to attend the ceremonies, which in addition to marking the nation's birthday will commemorate the 50th anniversary of the end of the Civil War. The invitation to the President probably will be extended by Representative Vane, who is expected to accompany Councils' Fourth of July Committee to Washington.

Early action in the matter of invitations is necessary for the reason that most of the distinguished men of the country are in great demand for addresses on the national holiday.

It has been learned that the Governors of many States would be glad to attend the celebration here, and it is possible, in view of this, that the executives of all the 48 States will be invited, though at first it was intended to confine the invitations to those of the 13 original States.

An elaborate and appropriate musical program is assured for the observance, as many of the leading musical organizations of the city have expressed a desire to cooperate.
